## PARISH NEWS

The Parish Council Meeting took place in the Parish Hall on Monday 20 September. Unfortunately, there were no members of the public in attendance. If you would like to know what goes on or would like to participate, please come along to the next meeting on Monday 18 October at 19:30. **Children's Playground:** Discussions regarding children's play equipment are ongoing with the Millennium Green Trustees. Parish Hall: Improvements are progressing and we hope to have these completed shortly. Jubilee Fountain: The next working group is on Saturday 2 October at 10:00am. If you have an hour to spare, please come along with fork, spade and gloves. Our District Councillor reported that in line with Government policy, planning decisions are to be withdrawn from central government and handed back to local councils in order that local communities control planning powers. Post Office Services: The Outreach Service for rural areas was outlined in the September Newsletter and the Parish Council need to know if this will be supported before a case is put to the Post Office. There was no interest reported from residents last month. ## CHURCH NEWS

The building work on the church is progressing well. There is now no roof, so, you could say it's a bit draughty, but in a week or so, a temporary roof will be in place. Certainly by Christmas, and hopefully, by the time we get cold weather, we hope to be able to put the heating on. Please don't let this deter you from coming to our services. We are soldiering on, in spite of loads of dust and rubble which cover the pews and floors during the week. Thanks to a few hard-working people, who did a grand job hoovering and dusting and washing floor tiles on Saturday September 25th. The Harvest Festival went ahead as usual, mostly up in the chancel. There were only about 25 people who attended, which was a bit disappointing but the main part of the church was clean and the few flowers and produce decorating the altar and window sills gave a cosy attractive feel to the place. It was a weeny bit parky though, I have to say! The Harvest Supper raffle raised £160 for R.A.B.I and £580 for the general church fund. Thank you to all who supported this event.

The Benefice Service on the last Sunday of the month is at St Michael's in Stewkley on October 31st at 10 o'clock. We had a good turnout at the last Benefice Service at Cublington, so it would be marvellous if the same number of Soulbury residents could come to Stewkley. The service will include a tribute to the Rev. Ian Ogilvie who will be finishing his duties here soon. He has been so supportive and helpful to all parishes in the benefice and I don't know how we would have managed without him -- badly, I think.

On Sunday October 10th we have a Christening as well as a Holy Communion Service, to be taken by both the Rev. Ian Ogilvie and the Rev. Peter Lymbery. Little William Bates who lives at Home Farm up at Liscombe with his parents, Oliver and Annabel Bates and siblings is being baptised, so come along and welcome him into the Church.

Until our new priest is appointed and resident in Stewkley, we are in an interregnum, which means we will need to ask retired priests to take our services on an occasional basis and rely on Peter to take some too, if he is well enough.
