INNOCENT HARRIS CHARITY A new trustee of this, the oldest of Soulbury Charities, has recently been appointed by the Parish Council, and we thought readers might be interested to hear more of the charity's history. Two cottages were left in a Will dated 1660 by Innocent Harris, a blind man. These were probably what is now the thatched property in Hollingdon, opposite Grove Farm. The rents from these cottages being £2 each, less the cost of land-tax and repairs, plus rents from two pieces of land of about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  acres in total, were given to the poor of the parish, "in shares varying from 1 shilling to 2s6d." (I wonder how The Charity was originally administered by the two this was decided)? churchwardens, but in 1940 the Parish Council was given the power of appointing two trustees. In 1941 the Trustees were given permission by the Charity Commissioners to sell the two cottages in Hollingdon, and invest the proceeds. This then resulted in an income of about £6 a year, which was held over until there was enough to distribute in cash to the elderly or poor. More recently the income has diminished and only occasionally (about every 10 years) can £1 or so be added to the Christmas parcels which are made up by the Stapleford Charity, and given to all the senior citizens in Soulbury.
