CENTENARY FETE PROCEEDS

The Parish Council would like to remind everyone of the meeting to be held on 27th September at 8.00 p.m., to decide on apportionment of the Centenary Fete Proceeds.

BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION

By now it is obvious that our village did not manage to gain enough points to be entered in the finals of this competition, but we were highly commended for our efforts. There were 60 villages competing. Our total marks were 81 out of 100; the finalists attained marks in the high 80's. The features which let us down were mainly weeds around the base of buildings such as the Church, the Club Room, the telephone kiosk and the bus shelter, some untidy hedges and verges and some litter in the telephone kiosk. We were awarded 8 out of 10 marks for overall appearance and evidence of community effort. Perhaps next year we will do better after learning from our mistakes.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN DEVELOPMENT CONTROL MEETINGS

(Planning Meetings of Aylesbury Vale District Council)

Members of the Public now have the opportunity of speaking at meetings when planning applications are considered. The relevant committee meets at the Council Chamber, 84 Walton Street, Aylesbury every 3rd Thursday at 2.00 p.m. There is a total time limit of 5 minutes for all objectors to an application. Normally objectors will be heard in the order they have notified the Planning and Building Control Department that they wish to speak until the 5 minutes have elapsed. Objectors may decide to make a joint submission appointing one or more spokesmen. Similarly the applicant, his advisers and supporters have a 5 minutes maximum total to speak. A speaker may not pose questions or interrupt other speakers, but the Chairman of the Committee may ask questions of objectors/supporters over matters of fact.

If you wish to comment upon a planning application you should write within the relevant time limit to the District Planning Officer setting out your views. At the end of the week before the Committee meeting, every person who has commented on proposals being considered will be contacted. If you want to speak you must then write or telephone no later than 4.30 p.m. on the Tuesday before the meeting. The contact person is Miss C. Dickson on 0296-555425.

It should be noted that not all planning applications are determined by the Committee.
