NEWSPAPER AND MAGAZINE COLLECTION

A.V.D.C. have given us further information about their door-to-door collection of newspapers and magazines, junk mail and phone books for recycling.

The new scheme forms part of the Council's commitment to the "Save Aylesbury Vale's Environment" initiative or SAVE.

The aim of the Scheme is to reduce the 50,000 tonnes of household waste which is currently transported by road each year to landfill sites in the Vale. Paper waste accounts for about 30% by weight of this waste material.

Blue bags will be delivered during the weeks 9th September to 20th September together with a leaflet which will explain what is required and when to put the blue bag out for collection. Collections will be fortnightly and will start on Thursday 26th September. These fortnightly collections will be on the same day as our current refuse collection (although because collections are made using a different vehicle, not necessarily at the same time).

Initially the scheme will be subsidised but it is hoped that it will become self-supporting. The scheme will be heavily dependent on public participation not only to ensure a sustainable success, but also to encourage the Council to increase the range of other materials collected for recycling like plastic or glass. We really should give it our full support. The future collection of cans and bottles will depend on the success of this paper collection.

The present collectors of our paper and cardboard waste have been consulted. They have done an excellent job and deserve credit for starting a service which was badly needed.
