PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The main business at the parish council meeting on July 29th was the amount of traffic through the village.

The position has been exacerbated by the imposition of a 7.5 ton weight limit on the bridge on the Wing to Stewkley road. This was expected to be in force for five years, until funds became available for strengthening.

About 16 years ago the county council had passed a unanimous vote to impose the three ton weight limit across Soulbury Green to stop lorry drivers taking a short cut to Milton Keynes. This was thwarted after representations from HGV operators in neighbouring villages. A 16 ton weight limit was imposed, later raised to 17.5 tons.

The parish council had asked the county council to review the situation in the light of the opening of the Leighton/Linslade southern bypass, but has now been informed that a low priority rating has been recommended at this stage because of the difficulty of police enforcement and the likely displacement of HGV traffic to less suitable roads.

County Cllr Brenda Jennings suggested that a petition might help focus opinion on the problem and such a petition is now in circulation asking for a 7.5 ton weight limit.

MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS

The first fund-raising event to take place will be in October, possibly the 16th. The Friends of Soulbury Church are organising a horse racing evening to boost the Millennium Green funds. This will be the first S.M.G. fund raising event to be held - more details will appear in October's newsletter, but meanwhile please consider coming along for a fun evening of horse betting in aid of a good cause.

Many of you have been very generous towards the Millennium Green - our grateful thanks go to you all and are extended to Michele Gardner, our friends of Liscombe Park, who have generously given of their time and machinery to cut the field for us. Liscombe Park has offered to give the field another cut when we require. Since the last cut in the middle of August the hay has been left on the surface, we are using this opportunity to rally those volunteers who have offered their services to come forward as soon as possible so that we can get the field raked before the next cut. There are three hay rakes so if there is a gang of you who would like to spend a pleasant hour or two in the hay! please telephone Liz on 270545 or Jane on 270532 for more information. Around the pond area thin stakes are in place, please be careful of these and we ask you not to remove any. Pond and ground level readings have been taken and these stakes are in the ground to mark out guide lines for the pond and path digging machinery.

SOS to all Cat owners: "Look what the Cat dragged in" is literally what Jon Sheppard would like to see! Any residents who live near and know their cats hunt in the Millennium Green are asked to help Jon with a survey of the fields rodent population. The help from our feline residents who are skilled hunters and are able to catch these little creatures is very helpful, but we need the assistance of their owners who are willing to put in a box or bag any small dead rodent before it is eaten and contact Jon Tel: 270377, who will collect it BUT if you are sure you are able to identify with precise accuracy what species of rodent your cat has brought you then of course you can pass the information on to Jon and dispose of the body.

There is to be another visit by the County recorders for insects and wild flowers. These visits are being done on a regular basis so as to keep an eye on the many species visiting or inhabiting the field, we do not want to upset the field's eco system through ignorance, or to cause any unnecessary disturbance to sensitive areas within the field, the good work done by these people will ensure we preserve the natural balance and keep in with the fields character with very little or no distress at all to the life forms living there. After the July moth watch/count no less than 63 variety and species of moth were caught, identified then released. There is a list available for anyone or group interested.

Thank you to all who have helped so far, we hope to see a few more of you very soon!


