MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS

All the plants on the Green have continued to make tremendous growth so that the tidiness of late June seems a lifetime ago. But this was never meant to be parkland and the natural areas are encouraging quite exciting insects and birds to come in and investigate.

A kingfisher has been spotted, and the dragonflies are glorious over the pond, which is burgeoning with wonderful bull rushes. Common blue butterflies, small coppers, brimstones, gatekcepers, meadow browns and painted ladies all range over the long grasses, and the thistle-down is like a magnet to large numbers of twittering goldfinches. The arable weeds' field is now ready for its first proper harvest. The Maris Widgeon wheat is ripe and needs cutting and carefully gathering into bundles to thresh out the seed for next year. With it will be the seeds of the cornfield weeds, poppies, corncockle, cornflowers and corn marigold which have flowered this year, all of which will be sown later in the autumn. To bring in the harvest and to prepare the field for next year we will have a

working weekend, September 9th and 10th. Times will be Saturday afternoon 2-5pm and Sunday 10:30 – 12:30 and 2:30 – 5pm. Do come and lend a hand, it will be a new experience for most of us. Contact Liz Miller 270545 if you can help.


