ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

On Sunday 15th August, Norman Cotton took his last service at Soulbury before his retirement. Not as many as expected attended the service – probably as the date had been brought forward. He preached an updated version of his first sermon in the benefice, bringing his well thumbed bible that lacks a cover, and ends midsentence where the last pages have been lost. This illustrates that you should not judge a book by its cover – people are not

always as they appear. Also the lack of ending shows that nothing is certain. The Church did not stop at the end of the Bible, but will always carry on developing and changing its understanding. Norman's farewell gathering for Soulbury & Stewkley took place in Stewkley village hall on Sunday 22nd August. The room was packed with as many as fire regulations would allow! Entertainment was provided by a number of villagers, including the orchestra, some amusing readings and a little known mediaeval dance called by John Kemp and accompanied by Jonathan Ginn on the fiddle. It was a jolly evening, but tinged with sadness at the impending departure of Norman and Maureen. A collection had been made round the two villages and Norman was presented with a cheque to help build a conservatory when they move to Steeple Claydon. His quiet efficiency and understanding will be greatly missed in all three parishes. Sunday 15th August saw the last time that the Rev. Norman Cotton conducted a service in Soulbury. From 22nd August he is on holiday, and then has a month of retirement leave. This is to allow him to pack up his house and prepare for his move. Norman therefore formally retires on the 24th October, although he is unavailable up to this time. Between now and then services are being covered by the Rev.

Peter Lymbery and other local priests. On 25th October the interregnum starts and at this point we can start looking for a new vicar. It is expected that the existing three parishes will stay much as they are, and a new vicar will live in Stewkley. The process of advertising for a Vicar, selecting from the CV's and interviewing can take some time. The selected person then has to settle their affairs and move. It is unlikely that this process will be complete before next Easter. During this time the Church Wardens. supported by the Ordained Local Minister (Peter in Soulbury's case) and the Rural Dean, take a greater responsibility in the parish. If during the interregnum you need to contact All Saints Church then the Rev. Peter Lymbery (01525 371235) or the Church Wardens, Harry Ayris (01296 688759) or Chris Bryant (01525 270607) are the contacts.
