After the singing of "Jerusalem" the minutes of the previous meeting were read and signed and matters arising discussed. It was agreed that our Pudding Club evening had been a great success and a healthy sum was added to our funds. Several members had attended the Group Meeting held at Great Brickhill and found the talk for the evening, "Tiller

girl to Vernon Girl" most entertaining. Also two of our members had a most enjoyable day at the Investigation and Discovery day held in Aylesbury.

It was then time for Jean Housley to introduce our speaker for the evening, Tony Eaton, whose talk was entitled "The Glenn Miller Story". Anybody expecting a musically-themed talk were in for a surprise. It was apparent from the outset that this would not be a wander down memory lane with Glenn Miller hits! Instead the focus was on his mystery disappearance in December 1944. By 1942 Glenn Miller had a most successful career as a band leader when he decided to join the war effort. He headed up the US Army Air force band and in 1944 he came to England where he played to numerous audiences. He then learned that the band were to perform in Paris. This is where the the mystery begins. According to press reports Glenn then boarded a single-engined plane which came down in the English Channel with no survivors. However, no trace of the plane was found and his disappearance remained a mystery. Various documents appear to throw doubt on this version of events and the theory is now that he flew to France by a different route, where he was badly injured and then flown to a hospital in Ohio where he died. However, this has not been authenticated so the mystery still has not been solved beyond doubt.

Tony Eaton was thanked for a most thought provoking evening after which refreshments were served.

Our next meeting is on Tuesday 11th April when the speaker will be Celia Feetam whose subject will be "Modern Medicines from your Garden".

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council took place on Monday 20 March 2017. There were 7 Soulbury parishioners present. Apologies were received from Alan Stevens and Maurice Cross. Minutes of meeting on Monday 16 January 2017 were approved. There were no matters arising. Various accounts were paid.

It was unanimously agreed to pay the one-off installation charge to have fibre broadband supplied to the parish hall. The parish hall will not be charged for usage. It was thought ideas could be developed for its use in the hall such as teaching those not so savvy with computers and the internet, particularly as some services can only be accessed via the internet these days.

It was also agreed to fund the prizes (6 \times £50 prizes) for the Schools Festival on 14 June on the Millennium Green.

The quote for grass cutting was agreed, amounting to a total of £4,000 for the year.

The usual council business carried on and our new Welcome Pack was on show for the first time. This is full of local information for new parishioners.

3 planning applications were discussed:

17/00722/APP 17/00166/APP 17/00535/APP

No objections raised for all three.

Neil and Janet Blake were present. Neil talked about unitary and the various issues surrounding it. Janet advised of the increase from £599 to £630 pa for home to school transport for those not eligible for free transport. Janet also reported on the problems trying resolve the poor construction of the A4146 bypass. Both advised on situation re housing over the next 20 years.

Re. AV Broadband, Neil said he would ensure that all works to install the fibre broadband were finished to correct standard and the village sign (broken by the workman) is replaced to same specification as the broken sign.

Soulbury Parish Council were about status on pollarding trees on The Green.

Greensand Country Landscape Partnership

£1.66 million from Heritage Lottery Fund awarded to help preserve the character of the Greensand Country landscape in and around Bedfordshire.

The Greensand Country Landscape Partnership (GCLP) is delighted to announce that it has secured £1.66m National Lottery funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund to support an array of exciting projects which will help us raise awareness of the hidden heritage of the Greensand Country and to reverse the gradual decline in the distinct character of this beautiful and loved landscape.

'Greensand Country' is an island of higher ground, which is made up of the Greensand Ridge and the surrounding river valleys. It stretches from Leighton Buzzard to Gamlingay, rising out of the flatter clay vales. The area's sandy soils were not suitable for agriculture, so by medieval times the land was mainly used for grazing, woodland, deer hunting and keeping rabbits. Much of this 'poor' land had been used to support the foundation of monasteries, but when these were dissolved under Henry VIII, the land was given away to those in the king's favour, who built their manor houses and parks up on the former monastic estates. As a result of this history, the area contains all of Bedfordshire's remaining lowland heathland, more than half of its woodland, and more surviving historic parkland than any other landscape in the country.

However, the landscape's very distinctive character has been weakening over decades due to modern development and changes in land use. Valuable habitats are becoming fragmented; views of and from the area are being lost or impaired and traditional heritage skills are dying out.

Please don't leave property in your vehicle

Thames Valley Police is asking residents and tradesmen to help prevent vehicle crime in Aylesbury Vale. Please take a moment to consider the following advice:

- When you park up your car make sure you remove any valuables from it. Don't try
 to hide property in glove boxes, boots or under seats etc. as criminals know all the
 places to look.
- Make sure that your vehicle is locked and the alarm is set if you have one.
- Park in a well-lit area if you can. Park in your garage if this is an option.
- If you need to leave tools in your vehicle consider installing a van security box or tool vault.
- Try to park your van against something that prevents access to the back of the vehicle.
- Make sure anyone acting suspiciously around parked vehicles is reported immediately to the police. Try to get a description of them and details of any vehicle they may be using. If they are on foot or on a bike try to see what direction they are going in.
- Don't leave it to someone else to make the call you may be the only witness. Call on the 24 hour Police Enquiry Centre number 101, or if you think a crime is actually happening at that time dial on 999.

Property left in vehicles can tempt an opportunist thief to break into a parked car or van. Don't make life easy for criminals and make sure they are not able to steal from your vehicle.
