# Church News - Philip's message

Dear friends,

The current upheaval in Zimbabwe has brought to mind my own memories of that truly beautiful country in which I lived and worked for a few years in the '80's.

Christmas and New Year in real heat can be quite a culture shock for someone brought up in a country where the festive season is characterised by cold, rain or snow, mist, fog and short days.

There is something slightly bizarre (and vaguely comforting!) about singing "In the bleak midwinter" in blistering heat by a swimming pool as meat is being cooked on the brai (Africans for bar-b-q).

Zimbabwe has been the 'breadbasket' of southern Africa which became the 'basket case' instead, tragically. All because one man's vanity made him and those around him believe his own publicity and turned a former liberation hero into a power mad destroyer of the very democracy he had striven to achieve.

What a contrast with the life of Jesus, born to displaced parents, living under a repressive foreign military power in collaboration with the local religious leaders and generally ignored by those of influence till the end of His earthly life.

Whether we live in an urban or rural, hot or cold environment it is good to remind ourselves of the significance of the baby born in Bethlehem 2000 years ago: as the greatest free gift to humanity.

Enjoy Christmas and the beginning of 2018.



# Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council took place on Monday 20 November 2017. There were 11 members of the public present. Apologies received from Chairman Victor Wright so Cllr Cross took the chair. Minutes of Parish Council annual meeting on Monday 16 October 2017 were approved. Under matters arising item 8 - Parish Hall, Cllr Stevens corrected the item as it was a smoke alarm, not a fire alarm, that was to be acquired. Various accounts were paid.

## **Planning:**

17/03956/AOP: 50 dwellings in the field opposite Valley Farm, Soulbury with associated services. This application had only just arrived so councillors have not had time to inwardly digest its contents. However, a delegation of 3 from Linslade plus one from Soulbury wanted the Council to object to it there and then. The clerk pointed out that the Aylesbury Vale Local Plan was being submitted in January 2018 so questioned whether any decisions would be made before a decision on that had been made. A decision by the Council was not made.

**Grass cutting:** finished for the year.

**Parish hall:** We were advised that at the Parish Breakfast one table collapsed requiring a deeper clean for the floor and the hostess trolley broke. The trolley will be looked at and repaired appropriately.

It was also highlighted that both fire exits need to be unlocked and kept clear when the hall is in use. This requirement will be added to the Terms and Conditions and Cllr Taylor was asked to include a note to this effect in the Soulbury Parish News.

**Soulbury Millennium Green:** several loads of soil have arrived at the SMG. The Sunday team of Community Payback lads will move it. We have been asked if we can take a second team on a Sunday. Cllr Stevens agreed for them to come. Bonfire night was a success but not all bills have been submitted to the Treasurer so the profit still has to be worked out.

**Public participation:** The council were asked about progress on another dog bin. Several months ago it was agreed to acquire one. Clerk to follow up.

Complaint received about lad on pushbike doing wheelies at the junction with Stewkley Road and causing near misses.

Green Farm - contact, as promised at the last meeting by Cllr Blake, has not been forthcoming. It appears, however, that there is a new planning officer with no knowledge of Soulbury. Matter will be pursued and update at next meeting.

When will Gigaclear finish their works in the village to provide super fast broadband. Matter will be taken to Cllr Wright.

**AOB:** discussion took place on the progress of refurbishing and repairing the finger sign. All in progress.

Vehicular access to Andrews Close is being prevented by bins being left in the wrong place. Council will write to resident.

**Date of the next meeting: 18 December 2017.**

## **Drink driving - just a little reminder as the festive season approaches**

If you drink alcohol or take drugs and drive, you put yourself, your loved ones and other road users at risk. Don't take the chance, it's not worth the risk.

Drinking any alcohol, even a small drink, makes you a worse driver. It slows your reaction times and makes you unable to judge speed and distance accurately. The only safe way is to avoid all alcohol if you are driving.

Combining alcohol and illegal drugs together is a deadly combination which can make a person 23 times more likely to be involved in a fatal collision

Never offer an alcoholic drink to someone who you know is driving.

Being convicted of drink or drug driving means you will lose your licence for at least one year, have a criminal record and could be fined up to £5,000 or go to prison.

If you are planning to go out and know you will be drinking:

- decide how you're going to get home before you go
- don't drive to the venue
- drink soft drinks until you get home
- book a taxi or use public transport to get home, or stay overnight

# Greensand Country Landscape Partnership



The Greensand Country Landscape Partnership (GCLP) launched in January this year, and has secured £1.66m National Lottery funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund to support an array of exciting projects across the Greensand Country area-based along the Greensand Ridge from Leighton Buzzard to Gamlingay.

Our partners will be busy working to improve the heathlands, woodland and historic parklands in the area, adding new walking, cycling and horse riding routes and training volunteers and staff in traditional, local skills. We're running events, leading guided walks, holding talks and debates and promoting painting, poetry and photography competitions, encouraging people to explore and enjoy their local landscape, and preserve it for future generations.

We're also looking to work with local communities to celebrate the history and heritage of the area. We're offering communities, clubs, schools or heritage groups the chance to apply for a grant of between £500 and £15,000 to help preserve or investigate the historic buildings, archaeological features or historic landscape in their area.

Our first grant project was a geophysical survey of the remains of Warden Abbey near Old Warden, which is now being used to create set of brand new paintings and drawings showing how the abbey would have looked in it's heyday in the 13<sup>th</sup> century.

We're now looking for more projects to support, and may be able to help your school, local community group, WI or local History Society make something really exciting happen around your village.

This could include helping to restore a building, surveying archaeological remains, mapping old fields and hedges, improving access to a historic site near you, or creating new interpretation about your area.

Projects can be based around sites from any time period, including the 20<sup>th</sup> century. We've given you a few ideas for what you could do, but we're happy to have a chat about anything and see if we can help you get involved!

As well as helping communities investigate their heritage, we also have grant funding available for landowners, schools, sports clubs and community groups who own or manage woodlands, heath or grassland.
