Church News - Philip's Message

A year ago we were commemorating the end of WWI, the war that was going 'to end all war'. 70 years ago we entered into yet more hell with the start of WWII, but that isn't the whole story of that 20 year gap.

1919 saw more wars than we'd seen for ages - Russia in the middle of a civil war, war between Hungary and Romania, 3rd Anglo-Afghan War, Turkish War of Independence, Irish War of Independence plus at least three other European/middle eastern conflicts!

2019 is no better, with all sorts of horrendous wars going on on every continent. What is it with humanity and warfare? Some of it is about greed and control of resources, need for ethnic domination/hate/fear? Just occasionally a moral or ethical principle has a bearing on the situation. As someone once said 'if war is the answer it must have been a really stupid question'!

All this of course is only one side of the story.

There are really warm, loving, practically caring people around but they are so easily overlooked in all the noise and clamour.

19th November marks the feast of St.Hilda of Whitby who lived in the 7th century and she called together the leaders of the northern (Celtic) and southern (Roman) Churches to try and settle the date of Easter for all the Church in England. Seems crazy to us today that this should be the cause of conflict but our clashes would probably seem equally mad to them!

All I know is that Jesus did not believe in violence as the solution to any issue and neither did any other religious leader worthy of the name.

As we remember all victims of war, military and civilian, let us all pray and work for better solutions.






Things are changing on the Green of late, the front gate has been repaired and the catch now does its job.



Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council took place on Monday 21 October 2019. There were 11 members of the public present. Apologies received from Cllr Ian Culley. Minutes of Parish Council meeting on Monday 16 September 2019 were approved. Under matters arising, Cllr Stevens asked about the current situation regarding the 3 Locks pub and the car park. Clerk has spoken to Cllr Neil Blake who will check to see what arrangements are/are not in place. Various accounts were paid.

Planning: There were no planning matters shown on the ADVC planning portal to discuss. Cllr Stevens asked if the planning department were aware of the parish boundaries as a couple applications went to Gt. Brickhill, again, which should have been sent to us. The confusion is around postodes we think, ie most of Soulbury is LU but some is MK. Cllr Blake did mention that the planning department was in complete disarray at the moment.

Children's Playground: Alan Humphreys is doing a cracking job looking after this area. Two villagers are working on getting play equipment. 4 companies have been approached. 2 have given idea of costing but raised questions around the lay of the land and mole hills. They were asked to get firm quotes. We also need to get landownership/lease on a firm footing in order to get grants inc. s106 money. Cllr Taylor suggested looking a WREN for matched funding as well.

Grass cutting: Last cut carried out today.

District and County Councillors were present and reported on current position on unitary council, East west rail and expressway (their routes and suspect benefits). VALP is still rolling on and on and on! HS2 - Govt looking at the viability but not stopping the decimation of our countryside. David Lidlington, now out of Govt, is against HS2 and fighting the scheme - which should have happened years ago. Cllr Everett reported on several initiatives started by children relating to environment and plastic, Woodland Trust tree planting scheme and Seeds for Schools.

Parish Hall: Hirings going well. Council was asked that they proceed with improving the outside of the hall, ie painting, sorting guttering and roofing, clean and tidy area. Inside, it was felt the loos and kitchen need to be looked at. Approved.

SMG: Progress good. 3 loads of pallets for the bonfire. Pond with fencing next major project. More carpet is required. 32 sq m was offered and accepted. Cllr Stevens wanted to make a public 'thank you' to the person who also cleans the EcoToilet. We don't know who it is but, as the general populace seem unable to use it without making a ghastly mess, the help is so appreciated.

Public Participation: TfB carried out walk-about re traffic calming and there is not a lot we can do. Jim is now our pothole reporter. Gully cleaning needs to occur as road water is not clearing as it should in the area of the Green. Conservation areas are being reassessed - is ours? Dogs have been seized by the police. Meeting with VAHT arranged. Huge improvement on SMG since they were seized and villagers are happy to use the SMG again. Copy of July minutes asked for but not received - copy will be obtained. Offer of Christmas tree for the Green made by a resident and gratefully accepted.

AOB: Soulbury Parish News: revenue lost as advertisers pulled their ads. Cllr Taylor asked for £200 to fill the void until the next tranche of invoices are paid. Cllr Day proposed and Cllr Stevens seconded the approval of this. Cllr Taylor also asked if, in principle, she could get advice and training for our website to be built on Wordpress. Once built, she could cascade the training so others can add content as appropriate. An offer was made to support her with this. Chairman agreed for her to get quotes to take project further. Willow tree on the Green needs removing as it has now died. Cllr Stevens asked for assistance from Cllr Ben Everitt in getting a Public Space Protection Order on the SMG so the situation we had with the dogs never, ever happens again.

Meeting closed at 9 pm.

This donation, made in her memory, will help make a wonderful difference to those we care for particularly as 88% of our income comes from voluntary sources. To give you an idea of how the money might help, it could for example contribute towards the cost of a carer. The one-to-one nursing care we provide ensures that the children are as comfortable as possible and are given the medication, attention and time they require. Parents and guardians are reassured to know that their loved one will be looked after as attentively as they would be at home.

Families tell us that the environment and ambience of Helen & Douglas House, which they describe as a sanctuary, is very different to that of a busy hospital ward. One of the most notable differences to a hospital is that we are able to provide care for the whole family - parents, siblings, and grandparents - during a hugely traumatic time, through our Family Support and Bereavement Team.

Thank you so much for your support and I hope that doing something so positive in your Mrs Norman's memory brings some comfort to you all.

Rural Crime Prevention Advice

Rural crime can be an issue for large areas of the Thames Valley. As the evenings begin to draw in, we would like to take the time to remind you of simple steps you can take to help prevent becoming a victim of rural crime.

From 6-13 October, keep an eye out on our social media channels for key rural crime prevention tips and local activity that we carry out daily in support of rural crime prevention.

These range from how to keep your machinery and equipment safe, to how to protect your land and boundaries.

At this time of year, we tend to see an increase in hare coursing, damage to fencing and boundaries, and acquisitive crime including theft and burglary in rural communities. It is important that you ensure your property is secure, fences and boundaries are looked after and that any suspicious behaviour is reported, providing as much detail as possible on the location and details of the people and vehicles involved.

Fly tipping is the illegal dumping of large items of waste. It is a civil offence to fly tip and so reports should be made to your local council. Reports of fly tipping in progress, with the offenders on scene should be reported to the police on 101.
