Church News - Philip's message

Dear friends,

It's the month we have to yet again change the clocks: back of course('Fall back' as our American cousins put it). For one I can't see any valid reason why we persist in this now redundant tradition. Because of our geographical location we are always going to have fewer hours of daylight in the late Autumn/Winter/early Spring and simply have to negotiate around it.

I remember in Zimbabwe having to get used to the fact that, whatever time of the year, it was pitch dark between 6/6.15pm. The only difference was the thickness of jumper/jacket you wore as you sat out under the stars by a fire being bitten by all sorts of bug life.

October is a very Anglo-Saxon month in the church's calendar: Ethelburga, Wilfred, Edward the Confessor, Alfred the Great to name a few of the more prominent. But, the date which always fascinates me is 31st. because it holds within it the classic balance of light and shade. On the one hand it is Halloween with all it's basically silly stuff around ghosts and ghouls etc - which seems to be developing into a super-hero fest. On the other hand it is the day we remember Martin Luther, the inspirer of the Reformation which changed the face of faith forever. Like all of us Luther was a deeply flawed man but had moments of great brilliance. He was alternately compassionate and vicious and very much a man of his time. His tempestuous personality brought many friends and enemies, probably in equal measure.

Our lives are, thankfully, much quieter but we still encounter those who love us and those who don't. The secret is to keep the balance between the flattery of the one and the destructiveness of the other.

The one person that Christians believe loves us unconditionally is God our creator and He shows that to us supremely in His Son Jesus Christ.

We then all enjoyed a delicious array of refreshments.







The Cricket Club are very pleased to announce that they have ended the season at the top of Division 3 of the Four Counties Cricket League. This means promotion to Division 2 next year! Since re-joining the FCCL in 2015 the team have worked very hard and gained promotion every year. Credit due to Captain Nick Mead, the players, umpires, scorers and all others who have contributed by keeping the ground in tip-top condition, the pavilion clean and tidy and not forgetting delicious teas!

The penultimate match of the season saw a Boot Invitational XI take on Soulbury Village XI. 13 year old Rhys Nicholas hit his first ever century in a 200 run opening partnership with David Tooth as Soulbury racked up 224 runs from their 30 overs despite dogged fielding from the Boot team, in particular Greg Bird and James Whiting, with Tony Crack impressing on his debut as a wicket-keeper.

Phil de Souza looked dangerous but tight bowling from the Soulbury skipper Nick Mead and David Tooth, who had a superb all-round performance, meant that the innings never really got going until it was too late. Scott Isaacs and Tim Collins making sure the score was respectable as the Boot ended 160 all out.

Credit must go to Soulbury Village who welcomed an inexperienced Boot team and made a fantastic day of it enjoyed by both teams and the many supporters who turned up. Hopefully it will become an annual fixture.

The day was rounded off with a Quiz, with Quiz Master Tim Collins supplying the questions. The Club's AGM will take place in November in the Parish Hall (date to be announced).

Parish Council News

The meeting of the Parish Council took place on 17th September 2018. There were 8 members of the public present. Apologies received from Cllr Ian Culley. Minutes of Parish Council previous meeting were approved. No matters arising.

Various accounts were paid. Defibs need new pads, battery needed for speed indicators. Approved to acquire.

Planning:

18/03142: 4 Rock Lane Farm, Liscombe Park - single storey garage/workshop to self-contained live work residential unit. No objection.

18/02980: Liscombe Business Park - Change of use B8 storage and distribution to B1 business with car parking and storage. No objection.

16/03246: Land adj 3 Locks Pub - storage/dist to dwelling. No objection.

18/03208: Upper Hollingdon Farm. To go to Hollingdon for opinion.

A member of the village was worried about the appeal for the Boot field as it appears to be a new application masquerading as an appeal. The appeal is apparently very derogatory of the village and the parish council.

Childrens playground: RoSPA done and passed but report needs to be located before payment.

Grass cutting: One more cut this year. Edges cut to 30 mph speed limit signs this time.

District Councillors: Cllrs Neil Blake and Janet Blake were present part-time. Appeal for Boot Field run past Neil who will look into it and report back.

Discussion took place re Expressway as it has been confirmed that Corridor B is Highways England's preferred option. It is not the AVDC's preferred option. It was felt that nobody knew much about this road and the implications, particularly at our end of the 'corridor', despite full details as is currently known being published in the Leighton Buzzard Observer. Full consultation will take place on the route of the road through this corridor.

Parish Hall: Cllr Wright will chase the acquisition of a fire door. Post meeting note: Cllr Stevens has organised for someone to check whether the one we have can be used with modification or need a new one.

Soulbury Millennium Green: Digger being lent by Lindsey Russell for further work on ditches. Good work on the annex already - Community Payback guys have done a lot of the labouring for us. Cllr Taylor is trying to change banks for the SMG and to do this, because the Parish Council is now the sole trustee, she has to give details to the bank of all the Cllrs as they become key account parties not signatories. She wanted, and received, permission from all cllrs to do this.

Public participation: Nothing further re Green Farm. Was expecting decision from Planning by 24/8 - not forthcoming. Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan (VALP) is online for all to see. Many questions from Govt to AVDC - awaiting final outcome.

Any other business: Nothing raised.

The next meeting is on Monday, 15 October 2018 at 7:30 pm.



Christmas at War: Talk by Michael Fopp

CHRISTMAS AT WAR

A Festive Talk by Michael Fopp



When World War II broke out in September 1939, it was not uncommon in Britain to hear the remark, 'It'll all be over by Christmas!' - just as people had said that World War I, would be over by Christmas 1914.

Unknown to people at the time, however, there would be five Christmases before May 1945, when this war was 'all over'. By that time the government's drive for maximum productivity had ensured that summer holidays were done away with, that Guy Fawkes' night had disappeared - the victim of blackout regulations - and that Easter eggs had disappeared, but at least the Christmas holiday still remained.

And what about the other side? Germany was suffering too and we should not forget their concern about troops in peril over Christmas.

An excellent way, therefore, to study the home front in Britain during the war years is to take a look at how Christmas was celebrated during those years. All over Britain in the towns and villages, on farms and in the cities, it was celebrated by rich and poor, old and young, so it can provide us with a series of varied annual snapshots, giving a picture of how conditions on the home front changed throughout the country, as the war progressed.

Residents can respond online, by telephone, text, or via a provided reply paid envelope. Please ensure you have responded to the form sent to you a several weeks ago.
