PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council meeting took place in the Parish Hall on Monday 17th November. We welcomed fifteen members of the public and it proved to be a lively meeting. The next Parish Council meeting will take place on Wednesday 17th December at 19:30, and all are welcome. Please note the change of day.

Wing North Police Team: Sgt Zoe Hardy introduced herself to the Parish Council meeting. She is new to the area and heading up our local police team. Welcome Zoe.

SuperFast Broadband: Are you interest in SuperFast Broadband coming to Soulbury? Don't forget to register at:

Our District Councillor, Neil Blake, is aiming for AVDC to put aside £1.5 million which will be match-funded by BBUK Broadband. He will be taking this to the next Council meeting for approval. Currently broadband coverage is poor in lots of rural areas and it is hoped that massive coverage of SuperFast Broadband can be attained in rural areas.

BBUK Broadband uses ADSL technology provided by BT to convert your normal telephone line into a fast digital line, bringing you all the joys of high-speed Internet access. AVDC are rolling out a pilot project in one rural village and if successful aim to have 91% of Aylesbury Vale rural areas covered.

Council Tax: Our District Councillor advised that AVDC have agreed to hold Council Tax again and there will be no increase this year.

The Mead Building Site: Many will be aware that six houses are scheduled to be built at The Mead, the site currently known as "The Wickets". Three houses are now occupied and the site has been abandoned. It seems that there has been a falling out between the land owner and the building contractor, which leaves the site a danger to existing residents. The situation has been brought to the attention of the Enforcement Team at AVDC.

A separate issue is the excavated soil which has been piled at the corner of The Mead. This was discussed and our District Councillor is asking the Enforcement Team at AVDC to issue a Section 215 for the ground to be cleared.

Paul Newman Homes: Paul Newman Homes' new development proposal for 300 houses at West Linslade certainly caused a stir when it came to public participation. Soulbury Parish Council agreed that the consultation company for the developers should hold a public exhibition in order that residents were able to see and discuss the proposal. This took place in the Parish Hall recently. The Parish Council have also met with the consultation company, Curtin & Co, to look at and discuss the proposal. To date, this is all that has happened. A letter was published in the Leighton Buzzard Observer which misrepresented the context of what was actually said. The Parish Council will be responding to this and requesting that their response is printed.

Distraction Burglary: Most people who call at your home will be genuine but sometimes someone may turn up unannounced, with the intention of tricking their way into your home.

If someone calls at your door:

- LOCK Keep your front and back doors locked, even when you are at home.
- STOP Before you answer, stop and think if you are expecting anyone. Check that you have locked the back door and taken the key out. Look through a spy hole or window to see who it is.
- CHECK Even if they have a pre-arranged appointment, check their identity card carefully. Close the door while you do this. If you are still unsure, look up a phone number in the phone book and ring to verify their identity. Do not use a phone number on the identity card, as this may be fake!

Bogus callers may be smartly dressed and claim to be from the council, police or utility companies. They can also turn up as builders or gardeners and try to trick you into paying for unnecessary work. You should never agree to have work done by someone who is just passing by. If you think work needs to be done, get at least two quotes from trusted companies. If you think a bogus caller has called on you report it to the police immediately via 101. If you have any doubts, keep them out!


