Church News - Philip's message

Dear friends,

When I was Chaplain at Holloway Prison in the late 1990s the Spice Girls launched 'girl power' on us, well beyond their girlhood years! Presently we have the likes of Beyonce and Kim Kardashian apparently acting as models for women who want to feel 'empowered': seems to involve stomping about a lot and wearing very little clothing. Very empowering for them and the canny businessmen behind them but not for anybody else except for those who enjoy seeing women merely as objects.

There are really empowered women around: Tracy Borman, Lucy Worsley and Mary Beard to name three great female historians on TV at present who can hold their own with any of their male colleagues across a whole swathe of historical study.

On 15th June the Anglican Church remembers a truly remarkable woman called Evelyn Underhill(1875-1941) who wrote powerfully about prayer, mysticism and Christian pacifism and also led retreats in Chelmsford Diocese. She came from a secular family and discovered God's love through an experience in her mid-20s and decided to dedicate her life to sharing her 'empowerment' with many thousands of people over many years.

A prayer by Evelyn Underhill:

The power of the Father, guide and guard us.

The wisdom of the Son, enlighten us.

The working of the Spirit, quicken us.

Guard our souls. Strengthen our bodies.

Our senses, refine; our conduct, correct; our characters, set in tune.

Amen.

Social Group

The Social Group met three times in May. Again, tea, cakes of many types on offer. Whilst we tested our general knowledge again there was more discussion on the arrangements for the presentation by Jez from the Greatmoor Energy from Waste facility.

The presentation was made on the evening of 16th and was very interesting indeed. We learned what can be recycled and why, and what happens to waste that cannot be recycled which, in the past, would have gone to landfill. It is taken to Greatmoor and processed. We were shown videos of this process and the end results, one of which is to provide power for homes. That fact means enough energy created 36,000 Buckinghamshire 'generating 22 megawatts more to me than the technical equivalent. of electricity' but that is Jez then went into the emissions of the process. All the processing means that emissions from the stack are 99.9% water vapour.

Our final meeting in May was afternoon tea at Lakers Garden Centre in Winslow. Lovely cakes there too.

So the Green goes on and things progress. The Hazels have been well and truly coppiced and now we need to dispose of the cuttings that have been left. We were going to get one of the Community team to start chipping them but we do not have a risk assessment for using a chipper, would you believe? Still it will get done among all the other one hundred and one jobs to do. The main area of grass is looking good now as Richard has been mowing at regular intervals. The newly grassed areas are beginning to shoot through too. Our small marquees have been out on loan and at the end of this month we need to erect the big marquee for a private function, so expect a phone call or two for a helping hand please. The meadow is a sea of yellow at the moment but will need mowing soon. Soulfest is on the horizon and this year's will be even bigger, as the charity we shall be supporting is 'PTSD Resolution', offering effective treatment for military post traumatic stress. We think this is a very worthwhile cause and one we hope you will come along and support. Soulfest takes place on the 14th July.

On 10th May the Soulbury Millennium Green Trust presented a cheque for £1,000 to Pensions4Paws. A photo of the event is on the cover this month. These funds will provide support for owners who take on retired police dogs or fire dogs in the Thames Valley and Hampshire Policing areas. As these dogs are aged and have worked hard in their life, vets bills crept up and once retired they are not supported by their respective forces.



Parish Council News

Resume of both annual meetings of Soulbury Parish Council which took place on Monday 21 May 2018. There were 5 members of the public present. Apologies received from Cllr Ian Culley. Cllr Neil Blake were present.

Cllr Victor Wright was reelected as Chairman and Cllr Maurice Cross was reelected as Vice Chairman.

Minutes of Parish Council previous meeting were approved. Matters arising: Cllr Stevens raised a concern about the standard of grass cutting in the churchyard. He tried to bring some normality back with the help of the Community Payback team but even they could not complete the task in the time.

Various accounts were paid.

Planning:

18/01329/APP: 7 The Mead, Soulbury - replacement garage. Retrospective planning has been granted for this as it is not in the right place and the wrong dimensions according to the original plans.

Childrens playground: Grass cutters could not get in as cars were parked in front of the gate. Cllr Wright will put a notice on the gate to ensure it is clear at all times.

Grass cutting: Doesn't go to the 30 mph speed limit in the Stewkley Road opposite the millennium green.

District Councillors: Cllr Neil Blake read out report from Bucks County Council:

- a) Minerals and waste: 20 year forward plan for the future of mineral prospecting and waste to ensure adequate supply of aggregates and waste management needs.
- b) Active Bucks: two new programs to be set up, one to target older adults aged 65+ and another to engage men and the Black, Asian and Minority ethnic groups.
- c) Modern Slavery: 6 month project set up by Community Safety team to raise awareness, offer support and help those affected by exploitation.
- d) County Council Budget: revenue budget for day-to-day spending £336m and capital spending of £122.6m has been agreed. Includes £26.7m investment in highways infrastructure and £36.6m on provision of school places. No more government revenue support for BCC. 2.99% increase in standard council tax along with 3% social care precept, equates to £1.40 per week increase for Band D property. BCC also receives £430m from government £310m is passed to schools and the remainder to early years and high needs.
- e) Children's Services: OFSTED rating remains 'inadequate'. Work ongoing to improve this.
- f) Mobile libraries: will discontinue from 1 June 2018. Alternative community-based arrangements will be developed.
- g) Transport for Bucks (TfB): £2.78m programme to repair county's worst potholes. £1.78m has been received from Dept of Transport for plane and patch repairs.
- h) Oxford-Cambridge arc corridor: 3 options identified.
- i) Modernising local government: Secretary of State has issued a 'minded-to' decision for a single unitary authority for Buckinghamshire. New SoS is James Brokenshire.

Cllr Neil Blake presented his AVDC report:

- a) Culture change programme: successfully completed and every member of staff has got through assessment process to ensure right staff are in the right job. Resulted in loss of around 10% of staff. Digital technology and artificial intelligence now being developed for provision of information rather than person to person contact.
- b) Income generation: providing services to other district councils interested in AVDC's approach above is providing income stream of around £150,000.
- c) Digital programme: offering information services automatically and via 'My Account'.
- d) Vale Lottery: Third year of operation, going from strength to strength. 170 organisations have signed up. AVDC selling initiative to many other councils.
- e) New Homes Bonus Scheme: has allowed AVDC to pass on some of the funds to local communities, and is only one of a handful of local authorities to do this as others use the funds to shore up revenue budgets.
- f) Aylesbury Town Centre: 4 restaurants and a couple of retail units with 47 residences above. AVDC retain ownership of ground floor to produce rental income.
- g) Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan: submitted to government inspector. Includes nearly 29,000 new home across the Vale, 9,000 of which are in respect of the unmet needs of authorities in the south of the county. Obligated to review it in 2 years time.
- h) East-West Rail: together with Oxford-Cambridge expressway, will open up new housing growth areas. Expressway corridors not liked by AVDC which suggests a hybrid of two of the routes proposed.
- i) Waste/recycling service: 17 new, more cost effective, vehicles bought. Pembroke Road depot to be expanded. Recent downturn in value of recycled items so contract needs to be renegotiated.

Parish hall: We now have electrical certificate. Need panic latch to exit doors.

Soulbury Millennium Green: Need to look at becoming a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). Cllr Wright will organise.

Public participation: Has Luton Airport redirected their flights? Lot of aircraft recently.

AOB: We need to appoint Data Protection Officer. Cllr Wright offered to take the role.

Gt Brickhill/Soulbury boundary: Peter Brown, Electoral Service Manager asked to move three residences into Gt Brickhill area. As the question has been asked he has to go to consultation. Opinions of the residents in question will be sought at this stage.

Date of the next meeting: 18 June 2018 at 7:30 pm
