

# Letter from our Team Rector



February is upon us, the month of Valentines! All those greetings cards with hearts and cuddly animals sat in champagne glasses... Now, I am not going to rubbish all that, of course I'm not. But I wonder if we can use it to say something about the love of God in Christ for us? - I hope we can.

The two animals often look the same; the Gospel tells us that Jesus embodied our humanity with divinity. Summarised best by the opening verses of John's Gospel (the Word became flesh) I think we have lost a sense of just how radical that was to those who first heard it.

Often the two cuddlies are looking at each other so trustingly; at a wedding I always make the point that love means we trust one another to be honest about how we feel – especially when we disagree.

And we speak of wearing our loved one's name on our heart, the seat of our emotions.

The Christian Gospel is quite clear that God's love for us is unequivocal, whether we are 'in a relationship' or not. # Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 18 January 2021 at 7.30 p.m via Zoom due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions. There were 5 members of the public present. Apologies received from Cllr Mrs M. Rowe and Mr J. Spires, Clerk to the Parish Council. Cllr Taylor was asked to take the minutes of this meeting. Minutes of the meeting held on 14th December 2020 were approved. There were no matters arising. Various bills were paid.

## **Planning:**

21/00071: 11 The Green, Soulbury - single storey rear extension  
The extension plan shows dimensions of the width of the residence, 6m. deep and 3.3m high. Concern was raised that this was a huge extension so Cllr Wright suggested a site visit.

21/00143: Change of use for the siting of an additional 119 lodge style caravans with landscaping and ancillary works at The Three Locks Golf Club, Partridge Hill, Great Brickhill.  
Considerable discussion took place and it was finally agreed that a letter of objection would be sent from Soulbury Parish Council. The objections are:

**GREEN BELT LAND DO NOT ALLOW IT TO BE CHANGED.**

1. Massive intensification of traffic movement on very narrow lanes to and from the current entrance to the site. Local infrastructure and small hump back bridges are not capable of this intensification of traffic.
2. Emergency vehicle road ways and turning circles.
3. Refuse vehicle road ways.
4. Sanitation and sewerage for 119 homes.
5. Danger of flood plains.
6. Adverse effect to the local ecology/biodiversity and wildlife.
7. Restricted amount of use for the accommodation.
8. Potential of human garbage dispersing into the wildlife.
9. If this happens, before we know it this land will become an housing estate.

## **Childrens' Playground**

The lease, together with some amendments recommended by our solicitor are in the post of Cllr Wright. Until that arrives we can do no more. The grass needs a cut - when it is less like a bog.

## **Grass Cutting**

Considerable discussion took place about the way forward with the project with included tenders, budgetting and contracts.

## **County Councillors:**

None present therefore no report.

## **Parish Hall:**

Ian Woodland has taken the role of looking after the hall. He and Cllr Wright spent time clearing the leaves from around the area and the guttering.

## **SMG:**

Invoice received for renewing the public liability insurance. Cllr Taylor established that the company has extended the period of insurance by three months for all their customers due to the pandemic.

## **AOB:**

Cllr Wright had heard there was some doubt about the elections again this year. He will keep us posted on the situation.

Sewage issues near The Mead are being addressed. Anglian Water have checked it from their side and done anything that needed to be done. It is now a case of finding the right person to talk to about the area up to that point - so far all have denied it is their responsibility. The Environment Agency is now being contacted.

Both areas where flytipping has occurred have been reported and dealt with.

Council is to purchase an upgrade to the Zoom account at £14.39 per month.

Cllr Taylor has rebuilt the Soulbury Millennium Green website. She has also changed the hosting package to cover both sites which should save money.

Council is working its way through documents required to be held by it. They needed checking for compliance, relevance for adoption. When each has been done, Cllr Taylor has uploaded them to the Parish website for transparency.

## Criminals Continue To Take Advantage of Coronavirus Vaccine Roll-Out As Phishing Email Reports Soar

**Action Fraud is raising awareness of another coronavirus vaccine scam, after it received a high volume of reports relating to a phishing email on Monday 25 January.**

The email, which attempts to trick people into handing over their bank details, was reported more than 1,000 times in 24 hours. It appears to come from the NHS and asks the recipient to click on a link to accept or decline an invitation to receive the coronavirus vaccine. If they click accept, they are asked to input personal information and their bank card details.

The national reporting centre for fraud and cyber crime has previously warned about coronavirus vaccine scams, with many people reporting receiving fake text messages purporting to be from the NHS.

Head of Action Fraud, Pauline Smith, is warning the public to remain vigilant as fraudsters continue to act:

“It’s despicable that fraudsters will take advantage of such an important tool in the fight against this evil and deadly disease. Not only are the people being targeted with this email at risk of losing money, or having their identity stolen, but they are also at risk of not receiving the real vaccine.

“The public have been fantastic at reporting these scams to us and raising awareness in their local community as well, but unfortunately, as this latest phishing campaign shows, we still have to remain cautious and alert. Remember: anything purporting to be from the NHS asking you to pay for the vaccine, or provide your bank account or card details, is a scam.”

How to protect yourself

In the UK, coronavirus vaccines will only be available via the National Health Services of England, Northern Ireland, Wales and Scotland. You will be contacted by the NHS, your employer, a GP surgery or pharmacy local to you, to receive your vaccine. Remember, the vaccine is free of charge. At no point will you be asked to pay.



# Soulbury Millennium Green







- HS2 and East West Rail.

There is funding available for projects which relate to the priorities.

The Three Locks Bridge. When the Three Locks bridge was demolished because it was alleged to be unsafe villagers of Great Brickhill were concerned at the loss of direct access to the Bletchley - Linslade and Soulbury roads. Now that the County Council are proposing to build a 14' 6" wide bridge there is a direct conflict of opinion between the Parish Councils of Great Brickhill, which favours the new bridge, and Soulbury, which considers it will be a severe traffic hazard as well as leading to a considerable increase in the volume of traffic through our village. Soulbury Council have asked for the support of the village in opposing the new bridge. This Newsletter will be happy to publish the views of readers either for or against the proposals

Jubilee Social Evening. This event is being held on Twelfth Night, Friday January 6th at 8.00 p.m. and it is hoped that it will engender the same friendly spirit which was apparent at so many of the Jubilee events of the past year. We publish below extracts from a letter received by the editor.

"Dear Editor,

After seeing your paragraph on Soulbury Stone in the November newsletter our newly formed organisation decided to make some enquiries on this matter. Firstly we obtained a copy of the original legend which reads, 'Every time the stone hears the church clock strike midnight it rolls down the hill and back again.' We then waited at the stone until midnight but although the strokes of the church clock were loud and clear nothing happened. We next arranged a microphone from the church to the stone and also played a recording of Big Ben striking midnight but again nothing happened, from which we decided that the stone is very hard of hearing. We then obtained a hearing aid and thus equipped again attended at the stone just before midnight and arranged the hearing aid and the Big Ben recording with four loudspeakers. The church clock then struck twelve as did Big Ben but still nothing happened. From this last test we concluded that the stone is stone deaf. Our final report is that (1) The legend as written is probably true.

(2) Owing to the extreme deafness of the stone any midnight gyrations are highly improbable.

## Greensand Country Landscape Partnership

### Celebrating Greensand Country - Stories of the Landscape, Oral History Project

- Do you live or work in Greensand Country?
- Are you interested in local history and oral history?
- Are you looking for a new challenge?
- Would you like free training in archiving, research and oral history?
- Would you like a project you can do entirely remotely?

Then this project is for you.

#### Project Overview

Greensand Country Landscape Partnership is looking for volunteers to uncover and gather stories, past and present, from across Greensand Country. These stories will provide inspiration for our commissioned artists, whose work will be presented during The Greensand Festival in May 2021.

A key part of the project is collecting living memories from those who know and love Greensand Country in order to build the Greensand Country Oral History Suite, which will be housed on the Greensand Country website. The final stages of the project will involve volunteers collating findings ready for the Greensand Country Archive which can be used for generations to come.

Volunteers will receive free training from industry experts in Oral History, Archiving and Historical Research to provide them with the necessary skills to embark on this exciting project. Training begins in January 2021 and the project culminates in May 2021.

#### Commitment and requirements

Volunteers will need to be able to commit to at least two hours a week for five months (approx. 50 hours in total)

You will need access to a computer and a quiet place to work

#### Training

Volunteers will be asked to undertake the following training in late Jan 2021/Feb 2021:

Four half day sessions in Oral history (remote learning, 25<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> Jan 2021 & Feb 2021 TBC)

One half day session in archiving (remote learning, dates TBC)

One half day on historical research (remote learning, dates TBC)


