

Letter from our Team Vicar

The Next Stage



September is of course the time of the year when the student-aged population routinely moves forward to the next stage – whether the next year group, or a new school entirely, or moving to university, or starting a new course, or whatever else it might be. Once people enter formal working life, however, it is no longer automatically the case that there is a reliable annual landmark at which one is clearly ‘moving on’. Promotions, job changes and other key landmark events in life aren’t laid down so neatly over time and any changes in direction are often unexpected, which will have been especially true for many

over the last eighteen months.

That having been said, it does seem that many people have responded to the pandemic by seeking to find new opportunities moving out of it and to bring back that sense of moving on to the next stage even though the previous or current stage in question might seem to have been ‘inflicted’ on us. Finding ways actively to bring in a distinct feeling of ‘moving on’ and making progress is important to us all in our own ways, not least for mental health, and perhaps it is even more therapeutic if this is gradual but consistent.

Socrates once famously said “the secret of change is to focus all your energy, not on fighting the old, but on building the new” and there is also reference in the gospels to the wise head of a household who brings out of his storeroom treasures new and old. Both of these point to the idea of moving on without ignoring the previous basis upon which any advance or change occurs. Even if we are no longer moving annually onto a new year-group in formal education the fact never changes that we build new stages upon previous progress, whether our own or that of others, and it might be especially worth remembering that this year.

Antony Saint

Antony Saint



Antony Saint who has died aged 86 was one of Soulbury's most recognised figures having been the landlord of the village pub, the Boot, for nearly 25 years.

Although the Boot was Antony's final tenancy before he retired in 2001 his connection to Soulbury ran deep for the majority of his life. As the first cousin of Bunty Pargeter he began to visit regularly in 1957 once Bunty and John had married. And despite his life taking a number of turns between those days and him taking the tenancy of the Boot in 1987 the village was always close to his heart.

Antony was born in Iver, Buckinghamshire in 1935 as one of twin boys to Stafford and Mary Saint. Stafford was the local GP and the family stayed in Iver for the duration of the war running the GP practice and the local cottage hospital.

Leaving school at 16 for Westminster Catering College Antony had found his calling in life at an early stage. National Service beckoned in 1953 and two years in the Catering Corps only served to strengthen his passion for the hospitality business.

An Assistant Manager position at the Limpley Stoke hotel near Bath led to the chance meeting with a young Lady Rose Chetwynd-Talbot and they were married in 1965.

Three children (Nell, Victoria and Alex) soon followed during the years when Antony was working his way up to the position of Catering Director at Ind Coope and in 1976 he decided that the front line of hospitality was where he had to be.

Antony took on the Cross Keys in Leighton Buzzard but soon moved the family into the Carpenters Arms in Stewkley, followed three years later by an award winning stint at the Bugle Horn near Aylesbury.

In 1987 the renovation project at the Boot became the most ambitious of Antony's ventures. Undeterred by the terrible state of the building he undertook a 6 month project to transform the village pub into one of the best food and drink offerings in the area.

After many happy years Antony finally called time in 2001 and retired with Rose to Gablehurst, at the heart of the village.

He will be sadly missed by family and friends but very fondly remembered for his entertaining and generous contribution to village life.




Soulbury Millennium Green

Shortly after the War when the village school closed there were only six children under the age of eleven attending the school and a handful of older children travelling to schools outside the village; at the time of the Jubilee last year over one hundred and thirty Jubilee Crowns were presented to children of sixteen and under. This represents a complete change in the make-up of the village and of the age groups living in Soulbury. It seems therefore that we are no longer a moribund community but there are very few activities in the village which are designed to interest younger people; even the future of the Youth Club is in doubt owing to lack of support, mainly parental. Surely there must be plenty of ideas amongst the younger element in Soulbury and is it not time to stop thinking that 'they' ought to do something and to start saying 'we' will do something?

Notes from the Parish Council Meeting of 9th August 1978

Playing Fields It was agreed to proceed with the proposition to establish an investment fund of £3,000 for the eventual acquisition of land for a children's playing field. The original capital will be obtained by a precept on the rates equal to a rate of about $3\frac{1}{4}$ pence. The old playing area in Mr. Pargeters field at the rear of the Church is no longer available for use and the perimeter fence has to be removed. The equipment that is still useable is to be re-sited on The Green. The Clubroom The Clubroom committee have a plan for enlarging the existing building; more will be heard of this soon. Public Footpath The demarcation and surfacing of the footpath on The Green is to go ahead.

Extra copies of the Schedule, Entry Form, etc. can be obtained from either Ken Scholefield or Louise Dawes. We hope that you will all support the show, both with your entries and your attendance. There will also be a tomato stall for which gifts will be gratefully received by any member of the Clubroom committee.


