A letter from our Team Rector



...And a star shone over the stable where the Christ child lay. One theme we'll be exploring in December's primary school assemblies is that of the Christmas star. We'll begin with the question "how old is star light?" because, of course, it takes years for star light to reach us so the images we have of the night sky are old; in some cases, very old. But here's the thing – for all the time it takes for the light to reach us, that light has never slowed down, never stopped, never veered off.

Light has fascinated humanity since our earliest days and for us in the darkness of a northern hemisphere winter, light has always been especially comforting. But we think of light metaphorically too; "oh, now I see!" and "a light bulb moment" meaning to understand and a contrast to being "in the dark".

Light is therefore used throughout the bible; at the start where God said let there be light to Christ, the Light of the world. At the very end of the bible, we read of Christ the bright Morning Star vanquishing darkness. Christ enables us to see.

We crave light; both to actually see and metaphorically, to overcome the darkness of injustice, wrong, hatred. In Christ we find Light; Light to see by and in His name to bring justice, right and love in so many ways. So, of course, a star shone over the stable where the Christ child lay; Christ never stops, never gives up, never changes his mind.

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 15 November 2021 at 7.30 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 3 members of the public present. No apologies were received. Minutes of the meeting held on 18th October 2021 were approved. Matters arising: Wendy advised she had contacted the solicitor to start proceedings to obtain the possessory title for the fountain and to seek advice on where to go next with the continual parking on the village green. Various bills were paid.

Planning:

21/04050: Rowley Furrows, Ash Farm, Soulbury Road, Wing - householder application for detached garage. No objection. Post meeting note: A query by Cllr Wright as to whether Ash Farm is in our parish prompted Wendy to check boundaries and, indeed, it is not so Wendy will not put comments on to the Planning Portal.

21/04389: Chestnut House, Stockgrove Park, Soulbury - crown lift Chestnut - bin lorries hitting it. Crown lift Cedar - risk to property and pole mounted electrical transformer. Fell Lime tree - proximity to neighbour also encroaching on pole mounted electrical transformer, will be pollarded first then felled for safety. No objection.

Childrens' Playground:

Kompan has quoted £8,096 for the disabled access. Cllr Wright has made an application for a grant from the local waste handling company, FCC. We are still waiting planning approval for the scheme although a decision should be with us by 16 November 2021.

Grass Cutting:

Robert Goss has been asked to trim all the hedgerows within the 30 mph limits in the village. It is believed there might be one more cut to the village green. Wendy will put the total of the year's mowing cost on the budget for next year. She will also ensure a contract is generated for the work for 2022.

Oak tree for the Village Green:

Cllr Day suggested we plant an English Oak tree on the village green to honour our Queen. It appears this will cost between £150-£250 and the best time to plant will be in the Spring. It was agreed to go ahead with the project and Wendy will add this to the budget for 2022-23.

County Councillors:

No report.

Parish Hall:

A new gas certificate has been obtained and service carried out.

Wendy read out the financial report for the village hall.

Water heater in the village hall kitchen is not functioning and needs repair.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations 2/6/2022:

A committee has been formed to arrange all activities associated with this event. Please see the page dedicated to the event in this magazine.

SMG:

Community Payback teams have only just started again and we have been told again that they cannot support us! Fortunately the growth on the SMG is low due to the season.

Excellent result from the Firework night in that we made £1281 for SMG funds and 407 people attended.

Wendy suggested that a calendar be created for fundraising. She will use her images, negating any copywrite infringements. SMG agreed this to be a good idea but Cllr Stevens suggested that if the images were of the parish as well it could be sold as a village calendar. This would mean that if any other groups in the village sold any they could earn some funds for their concerns too.

Public Participation:

Lindsey Russell advised that she is concerned that badgers are being poisoned. She has found five dead badgers and the only thing wrong with them is they are dead. No physical signs of road accident or being attacked by dogs, etc. Wendy offered to contact the Wildlife Officer at Thames Valley Police, PC Dean Kingham, for advice.



Soulbury Millennium Green





In the meantime the committee and I wish you all a very Happy Christmas and a better New Year.



Improbable as it seems, so soon after the wonderfully mild weather we have had until quite recently, it is time once again to extend the old familiar wish to all our readers for a happy and peaceful Christmas and a bright and prosperous New Year.

This year we have decided that instead of rushing to produce another Newsletter before Christmas we will include in this issue notification of events in the first week of January and will have the next Newsletter available for delivery by the first weekend in January.

We would like to apologise to our readers for the poor quality of the print in last month's Newsletter which was much below the standard we try to achieve. We hope we have overcome the problem and that this edition will be more legible.

Parish Council Meeting, 7th November. It was reported that the lengthy parliamentary processes involved in 'freeing' part of the Green was the sole cause of delay in providing vehicular access to Andrews Close.

The Parish Council unanimously rejected the boundary changes suggested by Great Brickhill Parish Council. Stockgrove residents were among those who voiced opposition to the proposal.

It was agreed, after a meeting of representatives of the Parish Council, Thames Valley Police, County Engineers and the United Counties Bus Co., that the present policy of stopping the local bus where required was in the best interests of the travelling public. Drivers would be asked, however, to avoid halting on dangerous bends.

Soulbury Methodist Chapel. On Sunday 3rd. December, the Annual Toy Service in aid of the National Childrens Home at Harpenden will be held. Sunday Schools from villages in the area will be taking part. If anyone would like to bring a toy to this service, we are sure that the children and staff of the Home would be most grateful for your contribution. The service will be at 2.30 p.m. and will be led by Mrs. Joan Gregory of Leighton Buzzard.

On December 9th there will be a Christmas Bazaar in the Clubroom, to be opened at 2.30 p.m. by Mr. and Mrs. R. Faulkner of Stewkley. Please come and buy your Christmas gifts here. Proceeds in aid of the Building Fund.

The Children's Carol Concert will be on Saturday 16th December at 6 pm. in the Chapel. Come and join in this popular event and encourage the children in their efforts to present the Christmas story.

A Christmas Eve Service will be held at 11.30 p.m. in the Chapel, led by the Rev. N. Burrows. During this service there will be communion and we invite you all to come and begin your Christmas with us.

Carol Singing on Monday 18th December. Singers will meet at the Stone at 7 pm. and walk down to Brook Cottages. They will sing their way from there through the village, along Stewkley Rd as far as the council houses, then by way of Andrews Close and the Green to Dean Farm Lane, returning to the Clubroom for refreshments at approximately 9.15 pm.

If you are unable to come at 7 pm. do join the singers en route so that we get a truly massed and joyful sound. And, for those who hear the singing please open your purses in aid of the Church Repair Fund. Remember that the church in this village is there for all. Help to keep it there for another six hundred years.



Two-factor authentication (2FA) is a way of strengthening the login security of your online accounts. It's similar to how an ATM works. You need both your debit card (first factor) and your PIN (second factor) to get access your account and withdraw cash. The main objective is better security. If your card is stolen, they still need your PIN. If your PIN is stolen, they still need your card.

Enabling 2FA will help to stop hackers from getting into your accounts, even if they have your password.
