Lent is upon us. Now let me be clear; I habitually eat broccoli because it's good for you, but broccoli is such an uninteresting vegetable and if I could give up broccoli for Lent, I'd be delighted. Which isn't in the spirit of Lent at all. Perhaps you have given something up for Lent; something you really enjoy. Or perhaps you are doing something extra up to Easter?

One of the big benefits of the church's year is that its regular and various celebrations give an opportunity to meet again the various aspects of Christian belief. But the downside to that is we might fall into the habit of just doing the same thing at the same time each year. Which isn't good for us, nor is it what Christian faith should be. The point of revisiting the regular celebrations throughout the year is to grow in our understanding as the years go by. After all, we do that in the rest of life.

Also, another danger of Lent is that we end up thinking more about what we've given up because we're not having it; or, idolising the 'extra' we take on. And doing without something we don't really like anyway misses the point completely.

Suggestion; I like to refer to what I call "A Good Lent". Lent has no big celebrations, no fuss, no planning required precisely so we can take stock of what we mean by truth, value (reference the 30 pieces of silver) and purpose. All of which culminates in the Easter story. Give something up/do something extra by all means, but may I wish you "A Good Lent"; a time with Christ to unpack life and living.

Attention: landowners

The Countryside Code was updated on 7 February 2022 placing more responsibility on the landowner to make it easy for land users to understand routes of paths/bridleways, potential hazards including animals, particularly for those who don't understand the dangers around some livestock and implications of misusing paths through crops. However, there is still an onus on the land user to act appropriately as well. Both landusers and landowners need to be aware of what the Countryside Code now contains.

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 21 February 2021 at 7.30 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 7 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Darbyshire-Mackay and Jordan. Minutes of the meeting held on 17th January 2022 were approved. Matters arising: none. Various bills were paid.

Planning:

22/00130: 2 Rock Lane, Liscombe Park, Soulbury, LU7 0JL - application for installation of external staircase from first floor rear down to garden. No objection.

22/00165: Durrance Farm, Stewkley Road, Soulbury, LU7 0DF - Change of use of land from agricultural/pasture land to B8 use and provision of hardstanding (retrospective). This description proposed by planning officer as appropriate following the withdrawal of original planning app. ahead of this re-application. No objection.

22/00363: 4 The Mead, Soulbury, LU7 0EG - Application for single storey side extension. No objection.

Childrens' Playground:

RoSPA inspection reports received for both the play area in Mount Pleasant and on the Millennium Green. Nothing serious - just one or two repairs that will be worked through.

Grass Cutting:

The recent Storm Eunice resulted in the Almond tree on the village green being snapped off at the base. All present were asked to think about whether it should be replaced and, if so, what with, ie another Almond or a Cherry.

Churchyard grass cutting:

The mowing of the churchyard was discussed. The Clerk will send the payment of £800 which goes towards the maintenance of the churchyard.

County Councillors:

Cllr Jilly Jordan was unable to attend. She forwarded a report which the Clerk read out covering the Council Tax increase of 3.99%, what it comprises and why. She also advised of grants still available for businesses suffering as a result of COVID Plan B restrictions. She updated on the efforts made by the Children's Services and the recent Ofsted report no longer judged them to be inadequate. The meeting with Planning and Enforcement was cancelled due to sickness and will now be held on 5 March. The full report will be put onto the website.

Parish Hall:

The Clerk read out the financial report for the village hall.

The hot water heater in the kitchen still keeps tripping out so Cllr Wright will look to sourcing a new element.

SMG:

Cllr Stevens reported that not a lot has been happening on the Millennium Green, apart from two trees which needed pollarding and the area being extremely wet underfoot. It appears ducks are beginning to call the area 'home'.

Wendy Taylor - Parish Clerk

It was proposed by Cllr Stevens, seconded by Cllr Day and unanimously agreed that Wendy should officially now become Soulbury Parish Council's parish clerk.

Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations 2/6/2022:

The Jubilee Committee is moving forward on arrangements. Details are being published in the parish mag and the clerk will set up a page on the website for the event. It was unanimously agreed to provide funding for food, banners, bunting, piper, etc. and should there be a surplus after expenses that this would be donated to the Royal British Legion.

Public Participation:

Green Farm development: Lindsey Russell advised she has had no formal communication with the planners but has heard that it may be turned down again but she will appeal. She apologised for the state of the buildings at present on the site but her hands are tied.

Drains by Liscombe entrance in Dollar Farm area are blocked so flood. Lindsey Russell commented on how lovely that area looks now the hedges have been cut back.

Discussion took place on who owns the hedge along the road by Poppy Lane. Council will write to Mr Pargeter.

Discussion took place on moving the gate to new road leading off Wing Road. Council said it should be pushed further into the field but Mr Parrott suggested this was not the best idea as it encourages flytipping.

Allotments: discussion took place around getting a meter for the water supply to this area.



Classic buildings such as Barclays Bank and NatWest Bank as well as The Swan Hotel were part of the history of the town as well as the site of the Old Corn Exchange in Lake Street, where the Library now stands. A lot of memories were roused by Paul's talk and he was enthusiastically applauded. Delicious refreshments were then served, the raffle drawn and the meeting closed at 9.45 p.m. We look forward to seeing everyone again in March when we will welcome a speaker from the Royal Flying Doctor Service.



Soulbury Millennium Green




The Millennium Green, like many places at the moment, is waterlogged. There are trees that have been affected by the recent storms, that need looking at and maybe taken out. We have pollarded two trees up at the far end of the Green to let more light into neighbours' gardens.

We need to dig more ditches to rid the annexe of excess water. However the water that we do have i.e. the pond has seen our first pair of ducks take to it, whether they will become firm residents remains to be seen.

We have received a RoSPA report that analyses the risks and faults of the play equipment and general state of the Green. I find it inconceivable that any inspectors can draw attention to such things as they do, but hey ho!, who are we to judge? All will be done in due course.



It is pleasant to be able to open this month's Newsletter with reports of the achievements to two of the younger members of the village.

Our congratulations to Jayne Norman are somewhat late for her success in coming second in a countryside competition to complete a project on Water and its uses. Jayne used her £5 personal prize to buy books and Wing County Secondary School used the £50 which she won for the school for the school to buy an incubator for the Biology Department.

Karen Giles was one of twenty five children who won a two-stage nationwide essay competition organised by the T.V.Times in conjunction with the National Trust. She was asked to imagine herself shipwrecked on a western island of Scotland. She was told there was a Steamer arriving once a week but that no-one was sure which day it would come. She was to place, in order of importance, shelter, warmth, food and water and then write an essay of 100 words giving her reasons for her choice. Karen's prize is one weeks holiday at the National Trust's Base Camp near Lake Windermere. The holiday, which will be in April, includes sailing, swimming and the study of wildlife. We hope she will tell us about it on her return.

We offer our congratulations to Karen also and feel it is a splendid thing for a small community like Soulbury to have two such enterprising and successful young people in its midst.

From the Parish Council Meeting, 5th February. Concern was again expressed at the District Council's proposal to take so large a part of the Green in order to provide access for vehicles to Andrews Close. It was agreed to donate a sum of £25 towards the cost of maintaining the Parish Churchyard. In response to a request from the District Council to advise on what facilities were available should any emergency arise, the Parish Council has forwarded details of the clubroom.

We have been putting some information here about the celebrations for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and what we, as a parish, will be doing but here is some of the detail thus far arranged.

A committee has been put in place to run both events. They are called the Jubilee Dream Team and are an enthusiastic group of people, whom most of you know, headed up by Scott Issacs.

On 2 June 2022 from 7 pm, in line with the national beacon lighting, we will be erecting a marquee on the village green so we can party the night away. The beacon will be lit around 9 pm. We have applied to close the road from the Dean Farm Lane end to the Stewkley Road junction just to ensure the safety of everyone. There will be music, cash bar and free barbeque. Several people have offered their help with this event as the marquee needs to be erected, equipment to cook on and serve from, chairs/tables/bar all need to be got to the area so please offer your support and join the camaraderie of the event to help to make it really 'swing' (as we used to say in my day!!)

On 5 June, 2022, 2-5 pm there is to be a fun day, Picnic in the Park style, at the Soulbury Millennium Green. Parallel Crossing In Place In Aylesbury

Buckinghamshire's first parallel crossing has just been completed at the junction of Bicester Road and Gatehouse Road in Aylesbury.

It is the first crossing of its kind in the county and Transport for Buckinghamshire and Thames Valley Police are reminding drivers, cyclists and pedestrians how to use them safely.

Drivers must give equal priority to pedestrians and cyclists and should slow down when approaching the crossing, look well ahead for pedestrians and cyclists about to cross and stop before the give way line.

Cyclists will need to check that traffic has seen them and stopped before attempting to cross the road, in the same way that pedestrians must at a zebra crossing.
