

A letter from our Team Rector



One of the big questions about 'church' is where does church happen? In the building, in the street? Or is it both? To find the answer to this and similar questions, the best place to look is scripture; when we look there, we find that Jesus did in fact go to both the temple (church) and out in the streets. Jesus spent a lot of time talking to religious leaders and he spent even more time with ordinary people, individually and with the crowds.

What we learn from this is that the life of faith is lived both in obviously churchy stuff like prayer, worship, bible study, but also in the life of the community; for if we only ever do the former, we become a holy huddle and if we just do the latter, we simply replicate lots of other good works. Jesus showed us that in fact church life and community life each inform the other and each then grows in strength and effectiveness. For how might we know what to pray about if we don't know the community? And how might we 'read' the signs and needs of a community if we haven't spent time listening to the voice of scripture?

Last month's Jubilee celebrations were really enjoyable across our eight parishes. They were a fitting response to the service HM Queen has given the country over her 70 years on the throne. But what I also enjoyed, a lot, was meeting and speaking to people I'd not met often or ever before. All our churches have at least one service a month which is not formal and whilst that is in the building (usually) they are aimed at exploring the cross over between inside and out. It would be great to see you.

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 20 June 2022 at 7.15 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 3 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Darbyshire-Mackay and Jordan. Minutes of the meeting held on 16th May 2022 were approved. Matters arising: None. Various bills were paid.

Planning:

22/01450: Willow Farm, Great Brickhill Road, Soulbury, LU7 0DR - application for two storey side extension. No objection.

22/01910 Land at Stockgrove Park, Soulbury, LU7 0BB - erection of barn. No objection.

The clerk read out a Buckinghamshire Council notification regarding the local plan for Buckinghamshire (LP4B) and Call for Sites. She also read out another notification regarding Buckinghamshire Council's project for 'Shaping a New Design Code for Buckinghamshire.

Childrens' Playground:

Cllr Wright complimented all those involved in the final 'drive' to finish this area in preparation for the opening on 12 June. Kompan completed the snagging issues although the closure on the new gate still needs to be addressed. Good attendance at the opening. The clerk took photographs and will get an image to the local papers with a press release.

Bin at Three Locks car park:

Buckinghamshire Council did as promised and removed the bin and cleared the area. Looked lovely for a while but rubbish is again building up. This time it is strewn across the carpark as there is no bin at all now. The clerk will write to Buckinghamshire Council and Cllr Jordan to get this resolved.

Parish Hall:

The Clerk read out the financial report for the village hall.

SMG:

The clerk obtained a quotation for adult fitness equipment from Caloo. Cllr Stevens is going to an event laid on by Kompan so asked for a copy of Caloo's quote to take with him.

Pond liner is an issue. Think the heron has been pecking at it but the water is draining out. Cllr Wright obtained details of repair kits from provider. Once water is drained efforts will be made to repair.

Public Participation:

It appears The Boot is closing on 11/7/22 for some sort of refurb and opening again 6 weeks later.

A member of the public asked if the Soulbury News Facebook page could be 'open' to encourage dialogue. Clerk has already addressed this with the original admin person of the page. They have moved out of the village and whilst the clerk has admin access as well she is no expert with it so will contact him in about a week's time (to allow him to settle into his new home) to get all the above changes done.

Any other business:

Clerk announced that the Dec22/Jan23 edition of Parish News will be her last as her current workload is too great.

Cllrs Day and Cross will work together to reinstate the finger sign on the village green.

Clerk asked to approach TfB to take responsibility for the gates on the gated road to Wing.

Cllr Wright to look for architectural drawings of the fountain as requested by the solicitor who is working on getting the parish council possessory title to it.







WARA COMMITTEE. Following the re-establishment of the WARA recently, a meeting was held on June 14th at 8.00 p.m. in the clubroom to form a Soulbury committee; the meeting organised by Mrs Jones was attended by Mr. Pargeter, of the central WARA committee, who explained the implications of the resurrection of the Third London Airport menace most excellently. More than 50 people who attended this meeting were told how the noise would affect them, and with the aid of maps which had been distributed, everyone could see just how near the new airport would be and that Soulbury, if it remained standing, would be uninhabitable. People in the village would be unable to sleep, talk, watch television or listen to the radio. It was stated that we would not be in the normal flight path of the planes but when the wind changed direction, which is an average of every three days in fourteen, life would be impossible. Although it was recognised that no decision had yet been officially made, an organised area of villages and townships around Hoggston could raise money to publicise our cause and be ready to spring into action without a moments delay should the need arise. Volunteers for the committee stepped forward and it was decided that Mrs. Muriel Jones of Lovett House would remain the contact for the village and any posters or car stickers can be obtained from her. The other committee members are Mrs. Pauline Walker (Secretary), Mr. G. Pawes, Mr. D. Hammond, Mr. K. Scholefield, Mr. Tate, Mr. M. Walker and Mrs. M. Pooley. We would like to thank everyone who attended and for the exceptional response to the call for a collection in which £24.63½ was raised. An open meeting will be organised shortly and anyone requiring further information is welcome to attend.

We reported in our March issue that one of the younger members of the village, Karen Giles, had won an adventure holiday in a two-stage nationwide competition organised by T.V. Times in conjunction with the National Trust, and she had kindly written a short report on her trip for us to print in this month's issue.

'My adventure holiday started when I boarded the Glasgow bound train at Euston. After a three and a half hour journey we arrived at Oxenholme in Cumbria. We were then taken on an hours coach journey to the National Trust Base Camp at High Wray, six miles from Ambleside. Our accommodation was pretty basic, the fifteen girls and two women slept in bunk-beds in one hut and the twelve boys and one man in another. During the week we were taken to various National trust properties including the late Beatri Potter's house. The highlight of the week was when Radio 1 disc jockey, Ed Stewart, came with us on a trip. As it was his birthday we presented him with two birthday cakes and a hand-carved Shepherds' crook. We were also instructed in doing canoeing on Lake Windemere, sailing on Ullswater, rock climbing and abseiling on Langdale Pikes and pony trekking around Tarn Hows. We also sent on long walks, mostly in the rain! Once we did orienteering but I found that I wasn't very good at that. At the end of the holiday we got on the coach to take us back, then on the train, then we were back at Euston station. We all enjoyed ourselves.'

Obituary - Brian Mead

We are very sorry to announce that Brian Mead passed away on 21st June.

Brian was the heart, soul and driving force of Soulbury Village Cricket Club. He was active for over 50 years as a player, groundsman, Captain (1975 to 1995) and finally Chairman from 1996 until his death. He managed the Saturday and Sunday sides and spent a great deal of time at the club making sure the ground and pavilion were in their best condition. Just 3 weeks ago he was checking the wicket preparation and then watched the match against Milton Keynes.

He was a founder of the local cricket league, originally the Reyven Bucks/Beds Border League, which grew from strength to strength and is now the Four Counties League with 6 Divisions and teams from Bucks, Beds, Northants and Herts. Brian was President of this League.

He lived in the village for over 20 years until he moved to Golden Riddy in Leighton Buzzard.

Brian was greatly liked and hugely respected by all who had the privilege of knowing him. We extend our sympathy to Lorna and all his family.

At the time of writing, the funeral arrangements are not known.

Smart motorways are up and running in many places across the country, including parts of the Thames Valley.

What used to be the hard shoulder is now a fourth lane and there are overhead signs above the lanes.

These will display important information such as variable speed limits and lane closures.

It's important that you obey these signs for your safety and that of other road users.

You'll see a red 'X' if a lane is closed.

This can often be set far in advance of an incident to help those who are dealing with it.

Make sure to leave gaps in the traffic to allow people to filter into an open lane.

Driving in a closed lane could result in a fixed penalty of up to £100 and three points.

National Highways and Thames Valley Police will be carrying out enforcement on these roads.
