# A letter from our Team Vicar



## The power of intuition?

This year happens to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of some pioneering work in weather forecasting by Lewis Fry Richardson, whose book *Weather Prediction by Numerical Process* was eventually published in 1922. The main focus was on using weather conditions one day to predict those most likely for the following day, though of course at that point without the aid of fast computers. He also extended his interest into predicting conditions and causes of conflict, which was considered of international importance for obvious reasons.

Clearly, behind any model or theory concerning how the world works there lie certain assumptions – part of our intuitive reasoning. It is quite right that we put such assumptions and intuition to the test, especially for something as important as accurate prediction and forecasting. We also know, especially from modern psychology, that we make assumptions without consciously acknowledging that we have done so (and, interestingly, Richardson himself later turned towards psychology in his thinking and research). Our brains constantly make models of the world around us for predictive purposes and often we are conscious of only a small aspect of this.

In a world in which prediction is just as important as it was 100 years ago, if not even more so, this seems a significant anniversary to remember, but also probably a time to think about how we can become more deeply aware of what our models, assumptions and intuitions concerning the world around us actually are. This will inevitably affect the way in which we *interpret* the many ‘facts’ and ‘data’ with which we are presented in the modern world, and (hopefully) discern what is true and helpful from what is misleading and misrepresented.

It is arguably a discipline in itself to become accustomed to doing this, needing constant care and attention. We certainly live in times in which this is becoming increasingly vital to our future, and taking this seriously now could potentially save a lot of misplaced prediction, false assumption and disappointment in the longer term as we realize perhaps more than ever that we need to shape our future outlook *together*, and in an interdisciplinary context, as the only species able to plan and predict in quite the way (and on quite the scale) that we can.

The parish is now, therefore, looking for a person or persons to take the magazine forward. I thought it best to announce this now so I can assist with any handover required.

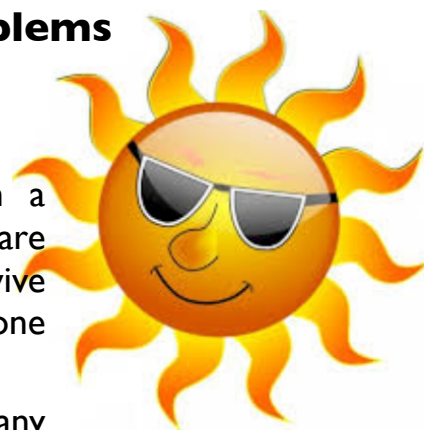

# Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 18 July 2022 at 7.30 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 2 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Cross and Jordan. Minutes of the meeting held on 20th June 2022 were approved. Matters arising: Clerk still waiting to hear about repairs to gates on gated road to Wing. Various bills were paid.

## **Planning:**

22/02008: Dollar Farm, Leighton Road, Soulbury, LU7 0JH - application for certificate of lawfulness for existing use of Units 1-4 for Class E(a)/A1 use. Parish Council supports this.

22/02181: Media Village, Liscombe Park, Soulbury, LU7 0JL - conversion of agricultural barn to 1 dwellinghouse. While the parish council supports this, it does feel a precedent could be set and wants two conditions applied a) the building is to remain single storey and b) must retain the footprint outlined in the original drawings. The Parish Council felt this development could be open to extensions both outward and upward and open the way for others to follow suit that overcrowding an area that is already suffering from lack of sufficient access by the many vehicles already using the Liscombe site.

22/02163: 15 Stewkley Road, Soulbury, LU7 0DH - application for single storey rear extension. Parish Council supports this.

## **Childrens' Playground:**

The Clerk emailed the Leighton Buzzard Observer and MK Citizen with a press release and photographs of the opening. This appeared in the LBO and on the front page of the MK Citizen.

## **Bin at Three Locks car park:**

The whole area is looking very nice now. As several Councillors pass the area on a weekly basis, a watching brief will be kept. For now the matter is closed.

## **Parish Hall:**

The Clerk read out the financial report for the village hall.

## **Reports from County Councillor:**

Cllr Jordan was not present. She sent a report which was read at the meeting and will be put onto the website.

## **SMG:**

Discussion around the Soulfest took place as a complaint had been received. The organisation of the event was complimented but the music was not.

## **Public Participation:**

Resident in Brook Cottages is having issues with the brightness of the street lamp outside 8 Poppy Lane. Work will be done to find out who owns it to rectify issue.

A member of the public raised the issue of overgrown planting that is impeding the view of the road along High Road. Parish Council will trim it back.

### **Any other business:**

Gt Brickhill Parish Council invited SPC to a meeting re their neighbourhood plan and proposed caravan park on 3 Locks Golf Club grounds.

Cllr Darbyshire-Mackay suggested Soulbury Helpers could be put on call via the usual number should anyone find they cannot cope with the hot weather.

Cllrs Wright and Day will look at the speed camera in Stewkley Road to decide if it needs an upgrade and replacing.

General discussion took place about getting more people involved with the parish events. The Jubilee really brought the parish together so we do not want to lose this. A Wine and Cheese event was suggested, with display boards showing what the village has done and wants to do. Cllrs Day and Stevens suggested walking football be started using the new upgraded facilities in the play area at Mount Pleasant. A date of 21 August at 2pm was agreed. Teams are needed.

# Soulbury Millennium Green

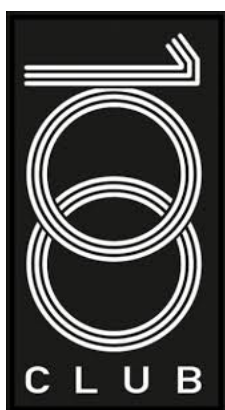

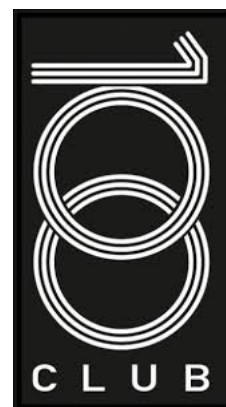

Unfortunately those signs are lacking the personal touch, although some of you may feel that you just could not go through all of this again. We must face the fact that there is the possibility that the airport may come to our area and as such our feelings on this matter must be shown, so we are asking all of you to get out any old piece of wood you may have laying around and the paint that is drying up in the shed and erect a sign in your garden. We are not asking for any Rembrants, just a simple NO will put the message across. In the near future the Committee will be putting a leaflet through your door, this leaflet will ask you to sign your name if you are against the airport. We are not collecting money (although all donations are welcome), all we want is a list of names that can go to form a petition. Please get everyone in your household to sign their name. Stewkley will be holding a sponsored walk on Saturday 8th September at around 10.00 am. The walk is planned to take in the whole perimeter of the proposed airport site which is approximately 15 miles and special drop-out points are arranged for those who are short-distance walkers. 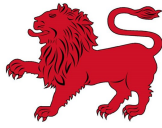

## Smart Motorway Safety Advice

Smart motorways are up and running in many places across the country, including parts of the Thames Valley.

What used to be the hard shoulder is now a fourth lane and there are overhead signs above the lanes.

These will display important information such as variable speed limits and lane closures.

It's important that you obey these signs for your safety and that of other road users.

You'll see a red 'X' if a lane is closed.

This can often be set far in advance of an incident to help those who are dealing with it.

Make sure to leave gaps in the traffic to allow people to filter into an open lane.

Driving in a closed lane could result in a fixed penalty of up to £100 and three points.

National Highways and Thames Valley Police will be carrying out enforcement on these roads.

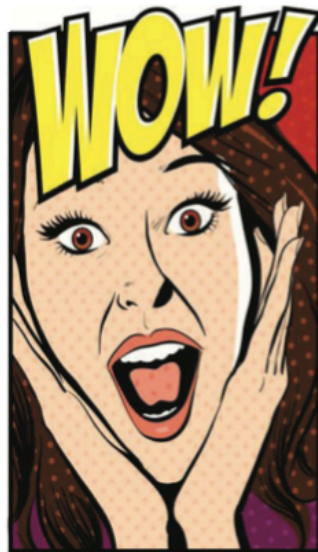

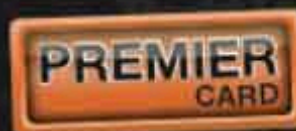
