Arthur Lazenby Liberty, the founder of the store, was a Buckinghamshire resident, a man of great intelligence and foresight. He was the High Sheriff of Buckinghamshire and was knighted in 1913. His nephew took over the business on his death in 1917.

November was our AGM, and once the business was finished we discussed the activities for the festive season. We will once again be making Christmas Wreaths at the Social evening in December. There will also be a Secret Santa and festive refreshments for all. We will also be collecting once again for both the LB Food Bank and the Salvation Army Toy initiative.

He told us the history behind many of the buildings we probably see year on year but had little idea about. We all enjoyed Paul's talk and it brought back many memories members had of the town.

SOULBURY NEWSLETTER

September, 1979

Since the first newsletter was issued in November 1975 we have carried many announcements of the amounts of money raised in connection with the various events in the village and further afield. The figures are by no means exhaustive as we feel that we were notified of some forthcoming events without being advised of the outcome but analysis shows that a total of £318.60 was contributed to the National Childrens Homes, Christian Aid, Multiple Sclerosis, the Red Cross and Cancer Research Charities in or closely connected with Soubury received the greater part of the surprising total of £5,656.05½ recorded in our annals, the church, including the choir, was the largest beneficiary with £2,524.39 and the Chapel next with £1,445.70. Other beneficiaries are: Christmas parcels £224.20, Clubroom £230.81, Social Circle £148.60, Womens' Institute £317.00, The Jubilee £221.00, the fight against the Abattoir £431.14 and W.A.R.A. £24.63½.

We must now face the prospect that, if Hoggeston is finally chosen as the site of the third London Airport, Soulbury as such will undoubtedly lose its entity becoming, if it survives at all, a small number of houses left after the vast approach roads, warehouses and other ancilliaries of an airport are constructed. The noise when certain winds prevail, will make it impossible to live in tolerable conditions in those remaining houses, much less to worship in either the Church or the Chapel should they still be standing.

It is against this threat that W.A.R.A. has been reformed and is again having to raise money. Enough has been collected to defray the immediate printing and poster costs but a great deal more will be needed to present adequately the reasoned objections of the whole district to the siting of the airport at Hoggeston. It is therefore necessary that we support, in every way possible, W.A.R.A. activities and fund raising.

The Soubury W.A.R.A. committee would like to thank all those who gave their time to help on Bun Sunday and to everyone who gave so generously splendid gifts of cakes and biscuits which helped to provide free teas. We would also like to thank Mrs. Hilary Pooley who so kindly opened her kitchen to serve the teas, a lovely garden for the occasion. All of our visitors were most impressed wit the warm welcome given to them and the lovely teas provided. All this resulted in W.A.R.A. gaining over 500 signatures for their petition and £203.86½ for their funds. Over 200 teas were served for those visitors who had taken the to stay and take a better look at the village and the church.

Would the person who reoved a large satin stainless steel tray from Church Farm House on Sunday, please be good enough to return it as it is one of a pair and in constant use. - Thank you.

PARISH COUNCIL Notice has been received from Buckinghamshire County Council, that the County are proposing to make a 24 hour Main Carriageway Clearway order, which will affect the stretch of approximately 925 metres of the A4146 in the vicinity of the Three Locks, plus two short lengths of the C20 road at the junction of these roads. The order in detail will be published in the Beds and Bucks Observer.

We would remind readers that they must not park their cars in such a way that footpaths are obstructed. They should also ask their visitors not to offend in this way.

It would appear that the Council will be building an access road on the Green for the houses in Andrews Close. The date for objecting to this has now passed and we would imagine that permission has now been granted for this work to go ahead. You may be interested to know that because the Green is common land the House of Lords had to be approached before permission could be granted. A diagram showing the proposed access road is available from Mrs. P. Norman, 11 The Green. We assume that once this access is in operation the temporary access from the bus stop will be closed. It is important that people using this approach road do not park in the turning points.

SOULBURY PRODUCE SHOW The schedule for the Soulbury Produce Show should by now have reached you. Entries will be accepted between 9.00 am and 11.15 am; no entries can be accepted after this time. The sale of produce will be at 4.15 pm and all proceeds will be for the Clubroom funds.

Watch your local press, or the notice from the schools which will be delivered via children, for further information. This, of course, refers to classes based at Wing.

Smart Motorway Safety Advice

Smart motorways are up and running in many places across the country, including parts of the Thames Valley.

What used to be the hard shoulder is now a fourth lane and there are overhead signs above the lanes.

These will display important information such as variable speed limits and lane closures.

It's important that you obey these signs for your safety and that of other road users.

You'll see a red 'X' if a lane is closed.

This can often be set far in advance of an incident to help those who are dealing with it.

Make sure to leave gaps in the traffic to allow people to filter into an open lane.

Driving in a closed lane could result in a fixed penalty of up to £100 and three points.

National Highways and Thames Valley Police will be carrying out enforcement on these roads.


