

### A letter from our Team Rector



Following the death of HM Queen Elizabeth 2<sup>nd</sup>, this is the first opportunity in the parish magazines to pay tribute to her. The Queen's seventy years reign meant she walked the public stage far longer than any politician could or would. Such a time period thus presented HM with many changes to our common life demanding immense resolve, perseverance and love. The Queen began her reign with an Empire which became the Commonwealth; there were freighted political issues which the Queen, on ministerial advice, had to negotiate; UK society saw a sea change in matters of divorce, abortion, sexuality and latterly, the law surrounding marriage; and there was the perceived need to modernise the Monarchy's image. These are what are called paradigm shifts. And throughout it all, HM openly declared her Christian faith.

As we reflect on HM reign, we realise two facts; one, societies never stand still and secondly, no-one should ever pretend that the <u>impact</u> of change is ever completely clear. Happening to have been monarch for seventy years is not the point; more so than all her speeches, the opening of this and the unveiling of that, perhaps the Queen's greatest contribution was to have demonstrated what dealing with questions of change looks like; in imitation of the Christ who addressed the spirit of the Law and the motivations of the heart, HM's continuous faith declaration showed a willingness to explore all life presents hand in hand with faith.

Just as HM kept an active interest in our common life, as we anticipate a winter of much uncertainty, please feel that you can come to any of the village churches and ask for help. There is no shame in that. We are discussing with parish councils having a rota of public buildings open for warmth during the day, there are foodbanks and advice with money and cooking. Please do not sit and worry.



### Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Tuesday, 27 September 2022 at 7.30 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 2 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Wright and Day. Minutes of the meeting held on 18th July 2022 were approved. Matters arising: Cllr Daryshire-Mackay will check she is set up at the bank correctly. Various bills were paid.

### Planning:

22/02664: The Pool House Stockgrove Park, Soulbury, LU7 0BB - Listed building application for light tunnel and extractor fans, internal changes to ground floor and boundary fence. Comments: No issues with regard to the internal changes to the Pool House. Regarding the application for fencing Pool House boundaries, this could be an issue as there are covenants in place restricting the introduction of fencing. This needs to be treated as a separate issue and residents in the area are investigating this in more detail.

22/02838: 67 High Road, Soulbury, LU7 0BT - application for garage conversion to habitable space and linked to main property by single storey front/side extension and single storey rear extension. No objection.

22/02905: The Limes, Stockgrove Park, Soulbury, LU7 0BB - T1 Beech crown lift, T3 Limefell to ground and replant, T4 Lime remove dead wood.

22/02906: Beech House, Stockgrove Park, Soulbury, LU7 0BB - T1 Beech crown lift

22/03128: Ange Hill, Leighton Road, 3 Locks - lower ground, ground and first floor extensions into 6 bed house with landscaping. No objection.

22/03137: Former 9 Stewkley Road, Soulbury - erection of semi-detached 4 bed dwellings. Objection: not sufficient room for parking, danger of reversing out on to busy main road, visitor parking will spill over into The Mead causing access issues to exisiting properties.

22/03146: The Cottage, Church Lane, Soulbury - reduce crown of Walnut tree overall by 2.5-3 metres.

22/03202: Durrance Farm Business Park - Certificate of Lawfulness for existing use which seeks to establish open storage. Objection: Planning has been refused for hardstanding and open storage already due to not being sensitive to site surroundings and adverse impact on landscape. Looking at the photographs supplied with the application they appelant obviously has complete disregard for this and has carried on anyway.

We have been advised of an appeal. Sandy Hill Farm, Leighton Road, 3 Locks was refused permission for this area to be anything other than a non-resdiential smallholding. Stables were built and used for a while as such but planning permission was sought to change them to residential use. An enforcement notice has been issued to return land to original state, demolishing the buildings, take away the mobile home and lift the hardstanding. An appeal has been sent to the Secretary of State against this.

#### Childrens' Playground:

Fencing to be replaced. Cllr Stevens organising site visit with fencer.

#### Parish Hall:

The Clerk read out the financial report for the village hall.

### **Reports from County Councillor:**

Cllr Jordan read out her report. It will be added to the website.

#### SMG:

Picnic in the Park event on 16 October. Free event, donations welcome. Fireworks 5 November. Tow new committee members.

### Parish Magazine:

The Clerk asked if the Council would finance the printing of the magazine to the Christmas edition. This is because The Clerk will be giving up editorship at Christmas. She has therefore not pursued advertisers which were all due in September due to uncertainty about continuance after January 2023. Council agreed unanimously to this.

### **Public Participation:**

Call for brownfield sites - Green Farm will be offered.

### Any other business:

Cllr Darbyshire-Mackay is concerned about the hardships that may occur this winter and wanted to organise assistance through the Soulbury Helpers. For those scared of turning on the heating could the parish open the parish hall for them offering coffee/tea. The Social Group meets regularly so they could use that facility - dates are always in the parish mag. Cllr Darbyshire-Mackay will link up with the Leighton and Linslade Helpers as well. The Clerk pointed out that the churches in area are opening their halls for warmth and sustinance as well. A note about that is in the October Parish News. She also asked that this issue be a continual agenda item so we can stay on top of requirements.

Many will have seen the recent announcements that Brian Mead passed away in lune of this year. Brian was the mainstay of Soulbury Village Cricket Club for well over 50 years. He was also instrumental in founding the original Bucks/Beds Border cricket league, which expanded into the very successful Four Counties League. The League thought it fitting to remember Brian's long service to the game and donated a trophy in his name. This year Soulbury Village Cricket Club played the FCCL Select XI, comprised representatives of many of the teams that played in the original Bucks/Beds Border League. Many of the players came out of retirement to take part and plenty of spectators turned up for a very pleasant afternoon's cricket and traditional cricket tea. Soulbury captain for the day, Brian's son Nick, won the toss and put his team in to bat, making a very creditable 267 for 9 in their 40 overs. After tea FCCL Select XI made steady progress towards the total managing to bat all 40 overs but were 67 runs short of the target again with the loss of 9 wickets. So the trophy was presented to Nick Mead by FCCL Chairman Martin Quinn - see photo. The trophy is to be awarded annually after a similar memorial match.

Many thanks to the Hunt family for manning the bar, Rachel for the delicious teas, Heather for extra cakes, umpires Gordon and Martin, scorers Chris and Mel, Roger, David and others for getting the ground ready, players and spectators who all helped to make this a great day.

They joined with nearly 200 others to preset to the Prime Minister the 60,000 signatures to the petition against the siting of the third London Airport at either Hoggeston or Yardley Chase. Mrs. Thatcher was also given a posy of red and white flowers in the form of the WARA emblem. The police commented on the orderly manner in which the protest was conducted.

At the end of the sponsored walk the total amount raised by Soulbury was £217; the highest individua amount was £43, raised by Heather Parrott.

### Weeks of Action Targeting Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking

Working in partnership with the National Crime Agency (NCA) and Europol, officers from Thames Valley Police identified a number of potential victims of modern slavery following three weeks of activity focusing on massage parlours under Project Aidant, an NCA-led law-enforcement response.

The activity took place between 22 August and 9 September as part of a Europe-wide operation, involving partners from Immigration Enforcement and local councils. The project aims to enhance and develop our knowledge of modern slavery linked to massage parlours, focusing specifically on adults or children (under 18) who have been trafficked to the UK, or exploited in the UK.

During this Project Aidant, officers visited 57 premises across the Thames Valley and encountered over 50 people who were spoken to about Modern Slavery and given advice. Of those people, 5 were identified as potential victims and safeguarded.


