A letter from our Team Vicar



Remembering past and future

In the church's calendar November is very much the season for remembering, which most obviously calls to mind both the more distant and the more immediate past, and especially when we think of, or actively commemorate, those who have departed this life in the service of others. All Souls' Day is the most universal of such commemorations, since it remembers the departed more generally without any qualifications placed on the reason for their departure, while other days look more specifically either to individuals who have set a very particular example or to groups who have given their lives for a common cause.

Since last November, of course, we have seen again the effects of conflict, particularly in the Ukraine but also in various other forms nationally and internationally. Conflict demands, among other things, that we remember not only the past and present but also the future – that we think about, or remember, what various aspects of life are *going to* have to look like in order to deliver what we require and to be sustainable. Short-term thinking is clearly not enough and yet there will always be a sense in which we are at least partially reliant on it as we try to get by from one day to another. Thinking about how we are best placed to respond to the necessary formation of a world for the future is, furthermore, something heavily dependent on the situation and viewpoint of each individual, in turn shaped by their past experience.

Matching this past, and all the remembering that has in one way or another come along with it, to a sense of hope and capacity for shaping the future can be a very tense experience, and it reminds me of a phrase I once saw written on someone's coffee mug which read 'past, present and future walked into a bar...it was tense!' Tension, however, can also be a means of storing energy. In terms of the potential that lies latent in our experience, learning and motivation perhaps that is one of the most helpful things to bear in mind as we fit our present capacities and viewpoints to remembering the need for a sustainable future out of respect to ourselves, to those who have come before us, and to those to whom the weight of responsibility will be passed.

Their first job was working in Woolworths on Saturdays but after leaving school worked in the accounts department of the Hemel Hempstead Local Authority.

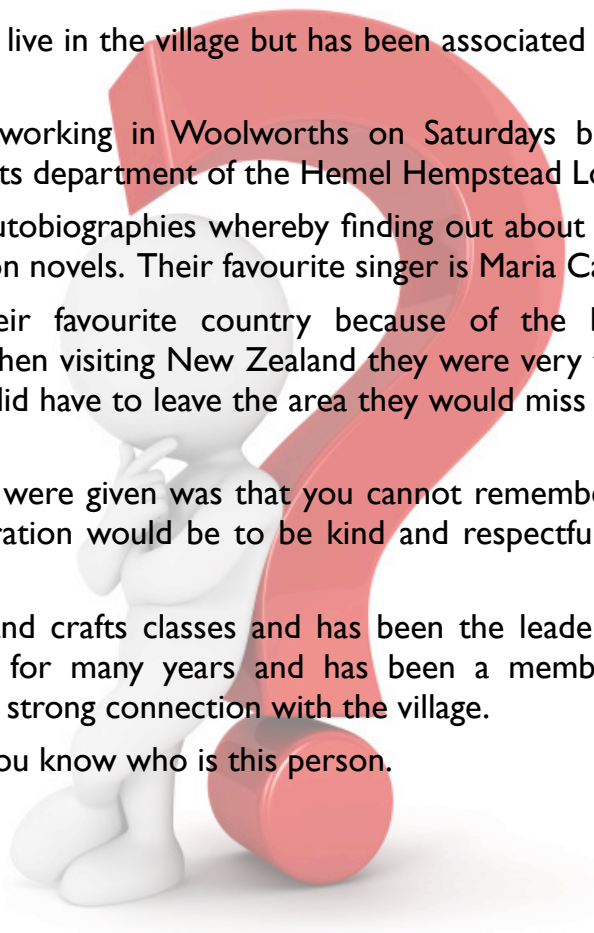
They enjoy reading autobiographies whereby finding out about other people's lives but also enjoy crime fiction novels. Their favourite singer is Maria Callas.

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Tuesday, 17 October 2022 at 7.30 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 5 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Darbyshire-Mackay and Jordan. Minutes of the meeting held on 27th September 2022 were approved. Matters arising: The issue of the editorship of the Parish News was discussed and it was decided to do a full run of the November and December/January issues to encourage someone or a team to continue with it. Various bills were paid. The budget process to identify the level of precept for 2023-24 was started.

Planning:

22/03342: Wing Wood, Soulbury Road, Wing - proposed security access and vehicular access to newly created woodland. It appears that since this was put on the agenda the application has been refused.

22/023447: Old Vicarage, High Road, Soulbury - cantilever first floor balcony at rear of property.

The clerk advised that she had received an email from Bragenham Farm regarding moving the entrance from a blind bend to an area with improved visibility. They asked who they went to for advice and the Clerk pointed them in the direction of Planning at Buckinghamshire Council

Childrens' Playground:

Council was advised by a village mum that dog poo had been found near the swings which was cleared up by her. As dogs are not allowed in the area this is distressing so a note will be included in the next parish news.

Goals need repair. Scaffold poles would sort out the problem. A MOP offered to supply scaffold poles but needed the length required. Post meeting note: information given and poles are being obtained.

Mowing of the village green

The clerk received an email regarding mowing the village green less so the Green does not look like a bowling green. Council were not keen to do this as in the past if the grass is left too long it is very difficult to cut and looks awful. There are issues around safety and visibility Council have to keep on top of. Council also feels there are areas set aside for biodiversity and rewilding, namely the SMG as one example.

Parish Hall:

There appears to be an issue with the toilets again which need rodding. However, it was felt that a company should be brought in to check what the issue is using a camera and then rectifying. The work will then be guaranteed. Cllr Stevens will contact an appropriate supplier.

Keys have been obtained so the top windows at the front of the building can be opened. It was noted that the upper pane in the middle window has 'blown'. Cllr Kemal will get the measurement and find a supplier of a new one.

It was suggested that the installation of a dishwasher would help those using the hall for functions which use the kitchen. Cllr Rowe was asked to take the suggestion to the Hall Committee and report back to Council.

Hall is now being used every other Friday for a 'pop-up' pizza outlet.

Financial report for the hall was read out.

Report from County Councillor:

As Cllr Jordan was not present the Clerk read her report to Council and will add it to the website.

SMG:

'Picnic in the Park' event on 16 October was poorly attended although broke even. The next event will be fireworks on 5 November.

The Coronation will take place on 6 May 2023. Depending on what arrangements are sent to parishes from the official organisers of Royal events it was thought that most people will watch it on the TV so there is no point in starting something much before 3pm. It was considered that we will 'do' something similar to that which was done for the Platinum Jubilee.

Public Participation:

MOP asked about having a private group rather than a community page on Facebook. Council was asked if daffodils could be planted on all the verges. Council agreed. Council was asked if an additional street lamp could be obtained for the area by The Forge as it is extremely dark in this area. Council agreed to look into it.

Any other business:

Cllrs Cross and Day will restore 'finger' to finger signpost on village green. Cllr Stevens will obtain this year's Christmas tree. Singalong will be held on 3 December. Council will fund a Cheese and Wine party for the parish in the parish hall. Date and time to be confirmed.
