A letter from our Team Rector



Christmas is upon us and I hope you will have a tree with presents beneath it. And under every tree there is also the gift of the Christ child. We may think of this 'Christ present' as a parcel in its own right or as a holy presence, but whichever, the Christ present is there to be opened, or not, as the case may be.

Despite the differing routines for present opening, they involve reading the label, maybe undoing ribbon, certainly removing the wrapping to reveal a gift. Allowing the Christ gift to be part of this is to allow Him to partner the chocolates, jumper, book, electrical gizmo. Christ becomes the frame within which the present finds its justification; the love, trust, commitment, all the emotions that underpin our festive giving find their home in the love of God for his world, a love that is incarnate, present, in our daily life. So you gave me the jumper because you love me and the gizmo I gave you says your happiness matters to me. This is framed within the Christ present because God says I love you, you matter to me and I have sent my Son to show you. The joy in giving is rooted in that ultimate gift. But of course, the Christ present is not always allowed to partner the giving. And when that happens, I think the festive giving becomes, well, all a bit flat. Are we to seriously suggest that love, joy, peace, all those wonderfully powerful emotions can be adequately contained by knitwear, confectionary and gadgets?

I know some find Christmas difficult and I'm sorry for that. But whoever we are, the Christ present is freely available.

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 21st November 2022 at 7.30 p.m in the Parish Hall. There were 2 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Darbyshire-Mackay and Jordan. Minutes of the meeting held on 17th October 2022 were approved. Matters arising: The Pop-up Pizza cafe in the Parish Hall is once a month on a Friday. The window in the parish hall has been repaired. Various bills were paid. Budget for 2023-24 agreed so precept can be applied for.

Planning:

22/03591: Liscombe House, Liscombe Park, Soulbury LU7 0JN - erection of 224 ground mounted solar panel array. No objection.

21/03662: Close Cottage, Church Lane, Soulbury LU7 0BU - work on several trees at site to reduce height and spread plus 10 cherry trees to be taken down to ground level. As this will be more of a decision by the Tree Officer, the parish council felt there was no need for comment.

Childrens' Playground:

Quote obtained for new fencing around the area. After discussion it was decided to go with Aaron Fencing as their quote included removal of old fencing and Cllr Day has used the company and knows the standard of work.

Grass Cutting:

Robert Goss has been asked to trim all the hedgerows within the 30 mph limits in the village.

Oak tree for the Village Green:

It was agreed to include a tree in celebration of our new King. Cllr Day will ascertain costs for this.

County Councillors:

No report.

Parish Hall:

Blown double glazed window now fixed, drains no longer blocked. Two uplighters not working in hall. Replacement bulbs will be obtained and fitted.

Wendy read out the financial report for the village hall.

Millennium Green:

Firework display made £840. A lot of people attended as the Leighton Display was cancelled. However, they arrived a lot earlier than the appointed 6:30 pm start and so food outlets were not crewed up sufficiently. It was felt we need to keep gates closed until the appointed hour as it was felt that those in early did not donate.

Any other business:

The 'Meet your Parish Council' Cheese and Wine event has been moved to 13 January 2023.

Christmas tree for the village green has been bought and Lindsey Russell has offered to collect it. Erection of the tree will take place at 10:00 am on 4 December at the beacon.

Alex Bonsor suggested that Liscombe Park can provide the village tree next year. He also welcomed the chance to discuss the accquisition of the Oak trees.

Speed camera now fixed and working.

Ditch on Green needs digging out. TfB wants a soakaway but Council felt a better job needs doing.

Cllr Day suggested an activity for the children of 'Beating the Boundaries'. It was suggested that as the parish was a big it was not expected that the whole boundary was included. More discussion needed but will take place in the warmer weather.

Wing Woodland: meeting to understand plans, etc to be held in Wing Hall on 22 November. Cllr Wright will attend.

New streetlight required for corner of High Road and Stewkley Road by The Forge as it is very dark at night in that area. Possible use of s106 monies for this project. Area needs a survey for best location.

The Parish Council meeting will take place on 19 December 2022 at 7:30 pm in the parish hall.

Thames Valley Police Releases Half Year Statistics With Nearly Half A Million Reports from The Public

As part of Thames Valley Police's commitment to give the public an insight into its work, today (28/10) the force is releasing statistics on its activity over the six months 1 April to 30 September 2022.

This period saw the force undertake one of its largest and most significant operations in its history, with more than 2,500 police officers and staff policing the committal service in Windsor of Her Majesty The Queen. Over the six months, the force policed high-profile Thames Valley events including Royal Ascot, Henley Regatta and Reading Festival.

Over this time, the force, which protects communities across Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire, received almost half a million contacts from public, attended almost 500 incidents a day and made 15,000 arrests; 30% of these arrests related to domestic abuse.




