A Letter from our Team Vicar

A Changing World?

By the time people read this the big event on the immediate horizon will be the Coronation of King Charles III, and the majority of the population will not have seen a live coronation in this country before in their lifetime. Out of interest I looked up a list of all major events that occurred in the year Queen Elizabeth II was crowned and compared it to a list of major events over the last year.

In one sense there was a marked similarity – it was the same type of mixture of good and bad news, including a variety of election results across the world, famous people either progressing in or departing from this life, world events (often involving significant clashes of ideology) that raised concern for stability, natural disasters and other accidents, and yet also new discoveries that inspired hope for the future.

In another sense, of course, it is clear that tremendous change occurred during Queen Elizabeth II's reign. One of the most major themes within this change has arguably been an increasing degree of independence, not only in terms of widespread decolonization, but also in terms of an increasing emphasis (at least in Western culture) on individuality and the uniqueness of each person's self-image or self-expression. Technology has of course contributed to this. Consider 1953 as the year not only of the previous coronation but also of the discovery of DNA and of the building of the first transistor computer, then compare with where biological and digital and technology are today. These discoveries have had a profound effect on both our understanding of the individual and the degree to which individuals are empowered, accompanied by some important ethical questions.

Recently, however, it does also seem that there has been an increasing awareness of our *inter*dependence, not least with respect to the climate crisis and the big ecological and economic questions it involves. Our new monarch is well known for expressing his deep concern for environmental matters, and perhaps the criticality of acknowledging more fully how interdependent we in fact are will be one of the most telling factors in the time of His Majesty's reign, not just nationally but also globally.

Parish Council News

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday 17th April 2023 at 7.30pm in the Parish Hall. There were three members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Maurice Cross, Nigel Kermal and Parish Clark Wendy Taylor. Below is a summary of the meeting.

Finance: The budget for last year has been submitted to the accountant for review.

Planning: Two planning applications were discussed:-

- 23/00899/APP The Council objects to this application on the basis that it is pushing the boundaries, bats reside in a nearby outbuilding and it is not in keeping with adjacent properties.
- 2) 23/01169/APP The Council objects to this application and does not support retrospective approval.

Environment

Grass Cutting: This will no longer be run by Friends of the Church. The Council have arranged for a gardener to carry this out at a cost of £1000 per year. Tony Crack confirmed that the Friends of the Church are supportive of this approach. Any payments owed to Friends of the Church will be investigated and repaid as required.

Oak Tree for the Village Green: The oak tree in celebration of King Charles III arrives on 19th May 2023 at a cost of £486. It is noted that it will need to be planted as soon as reasonably possible.

Gates on Wing Road: Suggestion of replacing with gates similar to those in Stoke Hammond. Costs to be obtained.

County Councillors: Cllr Jordan provided the following update:-

- New parking charges to come into force in April 2023 (Buckinghamshire)
- 98% of families received their first choice of primary school
- Potholes: new machinery will be used going forward
- Overview of the provision of support from Bucks Council for those who may be struggling

Parish Hall: Council to bill the Parish Hall Accounts for utilities (gas, eclectic and water).

Millennium Green: Preparations continue for the King's Coronation ceremony. Electrics are ready to be installed and this needs to be completed by 7th May 2023 ahead of the Coronation.

Public Participation: Frances Meichtry stated that she would be happy to support the development of the gym area intended for teenagers and adults.

Any other business:

- Discussion of ownership of Poppy Lane and potential Council involvement. An update to be provided in due course.
- Newsletter to be printed for individuals who do not have access to the internet or similar.

The Parish Council meeting and AGM will take place on 15th May 2023 at 7pm in the Parish Hall.


