A Letter from our Team Vicar

Seeking completion?

We are at the time of year now when many people are reaching big milestone moments in their life journeys, especially in the educational sphere. Many have recently finished exams and are awaiting results and many others are coming to the end of their time in a given school or college. Milestone moments very often involve a sense of completion of a particular task or phase. These moments seem especially important because we all like the idea of having what psychologists call 'closure' on certain things – promoting a feeling that we are truly ready to move on. Indeed, the famous philosopher and psychologist William James once said that 'nothing is so fatiguing as the eternal hanging of an uncompleted task'.

Completion, however, is always in some sense relative to a particular task or demand. We only complete *relative* to that demand rather than in totality. Other tasks and demands continue to surface. Moreover, the process of life in general preceded us all and will continue after we are gone, so we certainly don't complete the whole picture. St Paul says in a famous passage from one of his letters that we know only in part – we are partial beings both in the sense that we are composed of parts and in the sense that we are partial *to* certain aims, hopes and ideas more than others. We do not see the whole fully and we also therefore only ever achieve relative completion or closure in part.

Some aspect of openness therefore always needs to remain within ongoing process of life, which is far more than our individual lives. This greater whole isn't necessarily felt in milestone marking moments in the way that events in our individual lives are, so psychologically it may feel different, but we need to know it is there and enduring throughout all generations. If what we are part *of* is to become complete, or even be drawn towards its completion by God as the Author of Life, then we need to achieve openness to the ongoing process of life just as much as closure to certain past events. We need to hold a proper balance between what we know as a result of having moved beyond certain points in our life and what we realize we are yet seeking, what we yet need to explore.

With all best wishes to everyone for the next stage and especially to those currently awaiting exam results and other landmark moments.

Paul Mardlin - Obituary

It is with a heavy heart that I announce the death of a past Soulbury resident who had many friends and associates in the village. Paul Mardlin tragically died in a car accident in Buckingham on Thursday 22nd June.

Paul moved to our village in 1986 at the tender age of 19 where he resided in the flat above The Boot. He was forging out a career in the financial sector and subsidised his lifestyle by taking on weekend shifts behind the bar and in the kitchen where he realised his passion for cooking. It is here where he met the love of his life Samantha Petitt. They soon became an item and in 1995 Paul moved to Sami's flat in Linslade. The bubbly, fun loving young couple continued to do weekend shifts at the pub as well as frequenting it often, along with the rest of the 'Sunday Club'.

In June 1999 Sami and Paul married in Soulbury Church. It was at the time when our church bells weren't working and their friends stood ringing hand bells on their exit, it was very entertaining and full of love. In October they moved into Apple Tree Cottage, High Road which they extended and made into a most beautiful home. During their time there Paul really demonstrated his kindness and generosity by giving his time to organise four Soulbury balls along with his able assistants, Sami and some close friends. Not only were these events great fun for our community, the committee raised the grand total of £35,000 which was donated to Cancer Research and Sparx, a children's charity. They also paid for the children's playground equipment at The Millennium Green.

In 2008 Paul and Sami became parents to their beautiful baby daughter Poppy. I honestly don't think I've seen a more doting dad. A year later the family moved to a larger house in Mursley (as there were none for sale here) and a year after that they completed their family with the arrival of baby Tilly. Both babies were Christened at Soulbury Church and Sami and Paul renewed their wedding vows after Poppy's Christening in 2009.

Although they moved to Mursley, the family were still often seen socialising at The Boot or visiting their friends in the village. Sami stated last week that her heart is still in Soulbury as it holds so many wonderful memories.

We are all so saddened by this tragedy and it has had such a huge impact on our community. My heartfelt sympathy goes out to Sami, Poppy Tilly, Paul's Mum Christine and his sister Roseanne.

Paul's funeral will take place in Soulbury Church on Friday 28th July at 1.45 pm

Parish Council News

Soulbury Parish News – June 23

The meeting of the Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 19 June 2023 at 7:30 pm in the parish hall. There were 3 members of the public present. Apologies were received from ClIr Salina Darbyshire-Mackay. Minutes of the annual meeting held on 15th May 2023 were approved. There were no matters arising. Notice showing bills that were paid during the month was presented. It was agreed to make a donation to the Leighton Linslade Helpers of £200.

Governance

New political map being drawn up by Buckinghamshire Council. After consultation it appears that Soulbury Parish will be into the new Ward called Swanbourne and villages. Council advised that we have a new Cabinet Member for Communites who is Cllr. Arif Hussain. Cllr Jordan advised that her report this month gives a list of all such persons, what they do and how to contact them. This will be on the Soulbury Parish website.

Planning

23/01505: Liscombe Business Park, Soulbury, LU7 OJL - 700 ground mounted solarphoto voltaic array panels. No objection but to ensure grazing of, say, sheep on the land under panels to retain some assemblance of agricultural arable use. One complaint received suggesting panels be put on the many roofs available at the Liscombe Business Park but the cabling and roof reinforcement needed would be prohibitive.

23/01763 - Beech House, Stockgrove Park, Soulbury, LU7 OBB - erection of detached garage. No objection.

Gates on Wing Road

Clerk contacted Alex Bonsor who explained he is looking at a holistic approach regarding the grazing of animals. This will take a bit of time but he will stay in touch when plans materialise. **Churchyard mowing**

£800 cheque sent to Soulbury Parochial Church Council. Clerk advised Council of the position in relation to Parish Council involvement in churchyards/cemetaries having research it. Essentially PCs can contribute to the upkeep but the Parochial Church Council has the legal obligation to maintain it. PCs have no obligation to provide support.

Concern was raised that the contract we have with Heart and Soulbury Gardens is not man enough for the amount of work involved in the churchyard. However, Richard Caplan said it was more than adequate had the area been handed over in the good state. This has not been the case so there will be a party of people enlisted to do this.

Fountain

Cllr Day advised that the area of the fountain plus area needed for maintenance to be measured and plan drawn for the possessory title. The water is from a spring in the Bones' field and a lead pipe goes to the fountain. Need a letter from the Bones' confirming the fountain is not on their land (Land Registery seems to confirm this).

Adult gym area

The survey generated 2 responses - one for and one against!! It was therefore decided to scrub the idea completely. However, it was suggested that the Soulbury Millennium Green committee decide what they want on the area.

County Councillor report

Cllr Jordan read extracts from her report, which she will forward to the Clerk for inclusion on the website. She highlighted the low uptake for call blockers from Trading Standards and that scam calls have increased by 40% in the last 2 years. She also advised the Pothole Pro machine is doing a sterling job in repairing our roads. It hasn't reached us yet but there seems to be plenty of white marks drawn on the roads.

Millennium Green

Committee considering another event to replace Soulfest. Decided on Picnic in the Park event with a hog roast. Costs being established.

SMG AGM on 3 July 2023 in parish hall at 7:30 pm.

Any other business

Community Board meeting is 11 July 2023 at 6:30pm in Winslow. Clerk will attend.

Note from Bruno Peake that next year is 80th anniversary of D-Day landings so occasion will be marked with national beacons again. Clerk will register the parish's intention to be involved.

Notice received form RBL that we need to order our poppy wreaths. It was agreed we will buy our usual 17 inch wreath with 'lest we forget' inscribed ribbon. Clerk will also obtain the same wreath without the ribbon for the WI. There is a small price increase of £2.50.


