A letter from our Team Rector

As we move into November, our thoughts turn to Remembrance or Armistice Day. For those who take part, it is a poignant occasion when our world briefly stops and we remember; and we recite the names on our war memorials. And therein lies a challenge. We could be related to one or more individual whose name we recite and we may have been told about them from within our family, but in many cases, they are unknown to us (I used to know a woman whose three great uncles, brothers, are listed, but she never knew them). As time progresses, even family memories will fade and the challenge is thus how to remember? What is it we are remembering?

I suggest our starting point is to remember their humanity and this is where local history projects come to the fore. Discovering and recording the lives of the fallen local to our community suddenly emphasises that they were real people; Stewkley school has an excellent such project on display in the school foyer. Also, the Commonwealth War Graves Commission records their stories and maintains their graves, including the graves of those who died after the war from injuries sustained during it. Most of the churchyards in our group have graves monitored by the Commission.

But it isn't just the stories prior to joining up, it's also what they did once there. I think one of the most arresting is the Christmas Eve football match in 1914. The story of that camaraderie is well known, but how surprised was I to learn of a second truce! Easter 1915 on the eastern front on the shores of the Vistula River. For four days, Easter eggs were exchanged and placards in German and Russian proclaimed Christ is Risen! Significant I think, these happening at major Christian festivals.

The war to end all wars turned out a vain cry, but as we grapple with a world steeped in turmoil remembering the humanity of the fallen is how we meet the challenge of them not being known. And, perhaps, we might give some thought to how something bigger than war seems to have walked the battlefield on at least two occasions.



Bookings Co-ordinator

You will be looking after any bookings requested for the hall. The system for this has been upgraded meaning you will not be handling cash and anyone wanting to book the hall has to use the online booking procedure. You are there to check that payment for a booking has been forthcoming and answer any queries. You will also hold the key for any users to collect.

Full training will be given.

2. Caretaker

This can be a role for a single person or a couple. it requires making sure the condition of the building is monitored and arrange for any works necessary to rectify any issues. The area around the hall needs a regular sweep and guttering needs to be checked. You will need to ensure that electrical, gas and fire safety equipment checks are carried out at the specified intervals.

Full training will be given.

Both roles are voluntary but neither role will take up a lot of your time.

- Let us remember the servicemen and wamen and merchant seatorers of all faiths and nationalities - from all countries - who fought, suffered and died during the D-Day landings and six years of war.
- Let us all remember those in the Royal Nory, Army, Royal Air Force, Merchant Nory, and our Allies - the brove people who kept us safe on the home front and obroad and those in reserved occupations during the difficult time of war.
- Let us remember the brave dodors and nurses who cared for the wounded, the men and women who talled in the fields, the cool mines, the factories and the air raid wordens, police officers, firemen, ombulance drivens and the young people of the Socota and Guides who all played such a vital raile in the wor.
