A letter from our Team Vicar

We move once again into the Season of Advent, a season heralding the themes of hoping, awaiting and expectation, emphasizing that these ways of being carry deep meaning and are not to be trivialized. Furthermore, they are shaped as part of a larger journey, both as individuals and as communities on various levels. The Old Testament literature records ideas and events that led to a sufficiently significant shaping of the hope, awaiting and expectation of an entire people that they were deliberately and officially preserved for posterity. That shaping came through a great variety of means, recorded in many different styles of literature and expression, and involving many different people from different geographical origins and generations.

It is well known nowadays that *how* we anticipate and *what* we expect has very profound (and often very subtle and subliminal) influences on what we *believe* ourselves to be encountering in a given situation, which in turn influences our response. This includes any anticipation concerning where to seek God's engagement with the world – the way in which we anticipate will have considerable influence on the nature of our faith. Advent calls us to remember that God's conversing with us, including the very manner and nature in which we are formed as material creatures of space and time, actively shapes our hoping, our awaiting and our expecting.

The word Advent means 'coming to/towards' and the season reminds us that the source of this conversing, shaping and forming comes from God. We also have the little-used word 'adventitious' for something coming from outside of a particular situation or system – some influence that is neither the result of internal design nor intrinsic to a particular nature (such as human nature). With respect to what we remember and acknowledge in Advent, such formational influence lies outside of our own control or design but moves us to direct our capacity to converse with God and thereby shapes our hoping and awaiting. There will always be something unexpected about the way in which this works itself out, just as the specific way in which God comes to us in Christ was not fully anticipated and understood in advance by those who first encountered its influence and transformative effect.

The current global situation may not, to many people's minds, seem to give reason for much hope — at least, not a form of hope purely of our *own* fashioning. In this fast-paced world things could of course change significantly in various locations/respects even by the time we reach Christmas, but that landmark occasion still represents a transitional moment that would reform worldviews and shape the hope and expectancy of what would become not just a commun*ity* but a commun*ion*.

With prayers and best wishes as we move through Advent towards Christmas.

Parish Council News

Planning

The meeting of the Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday, 20 November 2023 at 7:30 pm in the parish hall. There were 3 members of the public present. Cllr Wright announced the resignation of Cllr Day from the Council. Minutes of the meeting held on 16 October 2023 were approved. Notice showing bills that were paid and monies received during the month was presented. **Governance** Budget will be discussed in more detail next month.

23/03340: Fields to the east of Soulbury Road North of Soulbury Road Farm, Wing - operational road to facilitate the planting and maintenance of woodland and subsequent access and egress for timber harvesting. No objection.

23/03397: Acorn Barn, Broad Oak Farm, Leighton Road, Three Locks, Soulbury LU7 0DX-householder application for single storey rear extension. No objection.

23/03418: The White House, High Road, Soulbury - certificate of lawfulness for proposed to recommence working operations on the erection of single dwellinghouse, new access and garage. This is to advise the Planners that work will recommence on this approved application. Curtailed due to health reasons. No need for comment on Council's behalf.

23/03429: 5 Laburnham Cottages, High Road, Soulbury, LU7 0DA - weeping willow to be repollarded back to old knuckles representing a reduction of 30%. No comment to be made as it needs to be left with tree specialists.

The meeting with the Planning department on 16 Nov 2023 at 10:00 at the Clerk's house was very useful. We were able to follow up on drive by railway bridge 141 on Leighton Road put in without planning and discuss the inadequacy of the entrances to the tracks to the first field in Soulbury Road to Wing, particularly in light of the planning application for the entrance to the new Wing Wood. Mark Aughterlony said he would investigate for us. On matters relating to Green Farm we highlighted that the village is now getting angry at the planners deliberations which leave us with an eyesore. We were advised that a pre App is being discussed but the content is confidential between the appellant and Planners.

Childrens play area: Clerk will follow up on the fencing quotation.

Churchyard mowing Lot of good comments on how the churchyard looked for Remembrance Day.

Fountain: Solicitor drawing up documents for submission to Land Registry.

Lighting: At the September 2023 meeting, due to a complaint about adding a streetlight to the area, it was decided to look into using 3 bollards with lighting instead. Having received some information and images of these bollards Cllrs were not happy, and are still not happy, about these bollards being confused with car headlights on this corner so it was proposed and agreed by all present that we will revert to obtaining a streetlight as budgeted for so this job can get done for the safety of the community.

County Councillor report: Cllr Jordan could not attend but sent a full report which will be added to the website.

Ditch on village green: A quotation of £2,415 inc VAT obtained from Tuckwells. Unanimously agreed to go ahead with this. Clerk to contact Tuckwells to arrange for the work to be carried out.

Speed Indicating Device for Hollingdon Road/Stewkley Road junction: A MOP has highlighted that this junction is getting more dangerous with speeding vehicles, particularly when trying to turn into the Stewkley Road with tractor with or without a trailer - hence asking to 30 mph limit to be moved and/or a SID to be used. It was decided that the Clerk

would contact the Local Area Technician (LAT) Matt Wincup to ascertain the implications of the above so a valued judgement can be made on where the expenditure is of most benefit. **Millennium Green** Firework night - made £2,385.01 and was enjoyed by all. Next event is the Singalong on 9/11/23 organised by Cllr Stevens. All in place, just need to sell the tickets now. Dates for 2024 events agreed: Easter Egg Hunt 30/3/24, Soulfest 22/6/24, 3/11/24 Firework Display, an additional funday being looked into for the kids.

Mrs Russell agreed to help with obtaining a digger to enable hardcore to be laid to extend the entrance to the SMG.

Parish Hall No further with the acquisition of caretaker but we do now have Scott Issacs to look after the hall bookings.

AOB: Real Christmas tree has now to be chosen. Bench for the bottom of Dean Farm Lane needs a rethink as the proposed area for it is outside the parish boundary which stops at the gate. Letter to be sent to Brickhill Homes Maintenance asking for the hedge and ditch on the edge of the area along the High Road be cut back and tidied up. Tractor seen day of meeting carrying out the job.

The next meeting will be held on Monday, 18 December 2023 in Soulbury Parish Hall at 7:30 pm.

2. Caretaker

You will need to ensure that electrical, gas and fire safety equipment checks are carried out at the specified intervals.
