

Ah, ha, of course when I think about it more St Paul would wouldn't he, he would be used to the Olympics, originating from where he did around the meditteranean.

We are also letting the dust settle on a new Government. They were allowed no quiet time to adjust, the new Prime Minister off immediatly to attend a Nato Summit and then quickly thrown in to deal with our riots.

Soulbury Millennium Green – August Report

The SMG Committee in keeping with previous years had no meeting, as August is normally considered summer holiday time when most families are away. However, towards the end of August we managed to hold an informal social & catch up/de-brief meeting jointly with the Soulfest Planning Committee at the Boot Inn. The object of the meeting was to relay the finalised financial results and provide feedback from local residents on all aspects of the event.

Soulfest 2024 De-brief:

Wendy provided the meeting with the Soulfest event final profit figure of £4227.89. A great result! This figure includes allowing for £380.00 to be offered to participating bands to cover their transport costs. She also detailed where revenues & costs originated from to realise the final profit figure, although as some of the sum up/square electronic payment machines were moved around due to battery expiry/signal loss, therefore the detailed revenue for some locations is inaccurate. We discussed this issue and believe we have identified solutions for the future. General feedback of Soulfest this year from our local residents and attendee's has been very positive, with all liking the new site format. The clearly defined area's for music, food & drink and children's fairground entertainments was greatly appreciated by all.

Whilst we all met at this combined meeting, we identified a date for next year's Soulfest which we believe will not clash with known events locally. We have identified Saturday 21st June for Soulfest 2025 and it was agreed to re-convene the Soulfest Planning Committee with the first meeting commencing 2nd Thursday in November at 7:30 pm (13th November).

Dog Walking:

It's been brought to my attention that some dog owners are not acting responsibly on the SMG site. Our grounds, including pathways, orchards, all grassed/meadow and remembrance areas are for all in our community to enjoy. These include children playing/exercising, families using grassed area's for picnic/recreational activities, senior citizens walking, as well as trained behaved dogs being allowed to exercise off lead. All dog owners should always be in control of their dogs and always clear up where their pet has messed which is the lawful expectation throughout our village. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis (dog roundworm), a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma, seizures and blindness. A Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100 can

be issued to anyone failing to clear up after their dog, which if the case goes to court can be increased up to £1000.



A5 northbound Little Brickhill exit & entry slip roads – maintenance

Dear Customer

I am writing to tell you that we plan to carry out maintenance work on the entry and exit slip on the A5 northbound, Little Brickhill. This will ensure the A5 continues to remain in a safe and serviceable condition.

We plan to complete this work over **one night** on **Tuesday 3 September 2024.** We will work between **8pm** to **5am**, weather permitting.

Closures and diversions

To carry out the work safely, we will need to close the A5 northbound exit and entry slip at Little Brickhill, and divert traffic as follows:

Traffic wishing to exit the A5 for Little Brickhill will be diverted to Kelly's Kitchen Roundabout and return to the A5 southbound before leaving at the south Little Brickhill exit slip.

Traffic wishing to enter the A5 northbound will be diverted via Watling Street, towards the Little Brickhill exit slip southbound and then travel towards the Flying Fox Roundabout. At the Roundabout take the fourth exit and head northbound back towards the Kelly's Kitchen Roundabout and return to the A5 southbound before leaving at the Little Brickhill exit slip.
