All Saints Church, Soulbury hosted the evening Institution, Induction & Installation Service of Revd Dominic Wright as the new Team Rector of the Cottesloe Benefice on Sunday 6th October. Due to Bishop Steven's pressing diary commitments during September and October, Dominic was licensed at Church House Oxford on Thursday 26th September during a small licensing service by Bishop Steven.

The service to complete Dominic's Institution, Induction & Installation as Team Rector of the Cottesloe Benefice was led by Associate Archdeacon – The Revd Canon Chris Bull, with Area Dean – The Revd Canon Val Plumb leading the Welcome. Eight Churchwarden's representing the eight churches within the benefice presented token gifts during the service as symbols of ministry. The service concluded with Dominic ringing a bell and the Associate Archdeacon leading him to his stall. He was then welcomed by the ministry team, members of the community and benefice congregation. Refreshments were served afterwards in the Parish Hall where all could meet and welcome Dominic, his wife Jo and their family in fellowship.

The service was very well attended with over 170 present in Church, our church bells being rung in advance of the service and an organist playing our partially restored organ. The string lighting that was procured by the Parish Council illuminated our Church pathway and entrance giving the occasion a sense of joyful festivity. Our grateful thanks and appreciation to all those volunteers in our community that assisted with flowers, food preparation, marshalling car parking, serving in our hall and welcoming guests in Church. A letter from our Team Rector

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us,

Hebrews 12:1

In front of a great cloud of witnesses from the eight churches of Cottesloe Benefice, as well as members of my last congregation in Solihull and other friends and family, I was finally installed as your Team Rector on Sunday 6th October. I think that this ancient service is where the word “installed” actually comes from in the English language as I was literally led to my stall (my seat) at the end. It was a joyful service full of hope and rejoicing. All Saints Church in Soulbury was packed to the rafters. A screen was set up for those sitting in pews with an obscured view and the service was livestreamed to those watching from afar. The path to the church was lit up beautifully, and the interior was stunning as all the eight churches came for this celebration. For some who have been leading the churches through the interregnum there was a palpable sense of relief at reaching this finishing post. For me my race here has just begun!

In my first week I have had the privilege of leading an internment (burial) of ashes for a faithful member of one of our congregations at the grave of another of his relatives in the churchyard. I also dug the hole in the ground which I’ve not done before. For Christians burial is a reminder of one of the most exciting truths of the gospel - The Resurrection of the Dead. When the bible talks about the great cloud of witnesses, who are cheering us on as if in a gigantic sports arena, it is referring to men and women of the faith who have lived and died before us. In ways that we cannot fully understand from this side of eternity we will one day be reunited with them and with God at the resurrection. That doesn’t diminish the pain and finality of death for us now. But it does point to incredible joy at an unspecified time in the future.

November is a month when we give thanks for this hope as we remember those believers who have gone on before us on All Saints Day (this year on November 3rd) and Remembrance Sunday on November 10th. I found it humbling at my installation service to think about the continuous witness to our faith in Christ over the centuries and over the millennia in these incredible ancient village churches of ours. We now have the privilege to stand in the same place ourselves to continue this worship which is echoes in heaven, amidst those who have run the race before us. I’m very much looking forward to meeting you and running this race alongside you!

Soulbury Millennium Green – October Report

As two members of the committee were unable to attend the meeting for October, this was a short meeting largely taken up discussing the forthcoming Fireworks event. It was agreed to leave discussions about funding our proposed circuitous route extension until after the Fireworks Event on 2nd November is concluded.

Finance:

It was reported that our finances still remain in a healthy position with our Current Account Bank balance standing at £12,313.18 and Petty Cash remaining the same at £49.01. Richard is now putting together information with Wendy supplying a list of purchased renewed parts for our existing Club Cadet Ride-on Mower for advertising it for sale/disposal.

Firework Display 2/11/24: The ticket entry price was agreed at £10.00 for at the gate, £8.00 for advance tickets bought through Ticket Source and children under 16 years old being free entry. Publicity material created to feature a QR code to link through ticket site. The Boot Inn have agreed to pay for a pre-agreed pitch site and will provide the bar for this event. The Children's Trampoline fairground ride is also expected to feature again this year with a Candy Floss stall. We also expect to run our Barbecue Burgers & Hotdogs food tent. We are currently urgently seeking wooden pallets for our bonfire as we have not been able to obtain these so readily this year. Vic has been tasked with sourcing fireworks (reduced noise level) and has been provided with an increased budget. It is hoped that an extra Community Payback Team can be made available during the last week of October to assist with the event set-up, with volunteers & committee members completing the final elements on Saturday morning at 10:00 am.

The meeting of Soulbury Parish Council was held on Monday 21 October 2024 at 7.30pm in the Parish Hall. There were 2 members of the public present. Apologies were received from Cllrs Maurice Cross and Salina Darbyshire Mackay. Minutes of meeting on 16 September 2024 were agreed as correct. Matters arising: none. All monies paid and received noted by all and Cllr Wright signed the September bank statement.

It was noted that the unitary and parish elections will occur on 1 May 2025. We now need to canvas the parish for new people who will stand for election to the parish council.

Planning:

24/03088: Rammamere Heath, Soulbury - T1 - Pedunculate oak - fell, leaving stump at 1m. - basal cavity, decay on stem. Arborist will deal.

24/02982: Valley Farm, Soulbury, LU7 0JJ - EIA Screening request for a proposed 57MW solar farm with a new access from Leighton Road and associated landscaping. Need more information.

23/A2025: Winscott Farm, Stewkley Road, Soulbury, LU7 0DJ - discharge of Condition 3 (Historic Building Recording Report produced by Albion Archaeology). No comment.

24/02786: 7 High Road, Soulbury, LU7 0BT - T1 Ash Tree 20-25% of canopy, crown clean removing no more than 10% of internal canopy leaving a balanced. No comment

24/02774: Rammamere House, Stockgrove Park, Soulbury LU7 0BB - variation of Condition 2 -(plans) relating 23/03503/APP. No comment

Environment

Fountain: Nothing further to report.

Allotments: Cllr Kemal attended a course for allotment management. It appears, having observed how others are run, that we do not need to make any changes. He did point out that other sites did charge deposits to cover situations where people abandoned their plots.

County Councillor Cllr Jordan presented her report which will be added to the website.

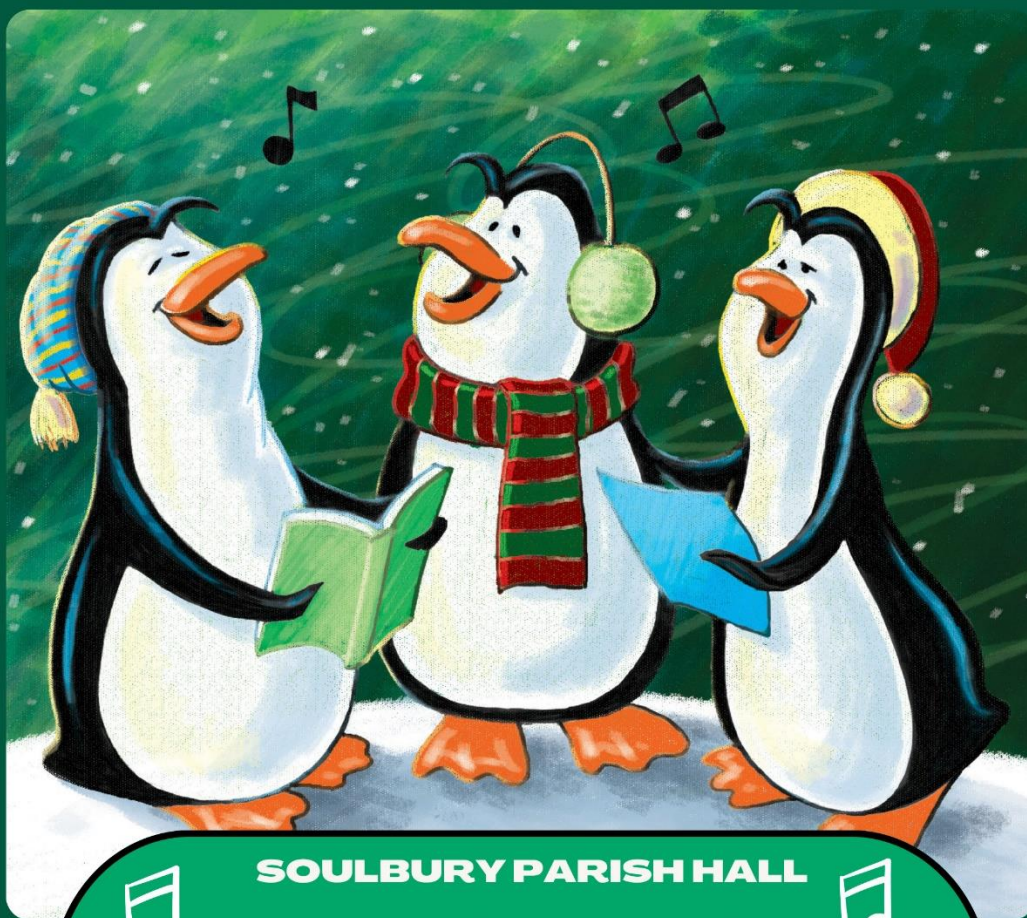

Could you get pension credit?

Following the government's decision to withdraw the winter fuel payment from most pensioners, Buckinghamshire Council is advising residents of pensionable age and their friends and families that it's vital they find out which government benefits they can claim to help them meet their living and fuel costs.

The winter fuel payment is now limited to people over state pension age (currently 66) who are receiving pension credit or a limited number of other benefits.

Older people over state pension age and on a low income may qualify for pension credit – which offers support for a range of household expenses including the winter fuel payment, but many are not aware and are not claiming this support that they are eligible for.

According to the government, only about 60% of eligible people currently claim pension credit countrywide. This means four out of 10 eligible pensioners are missing out on benefits of up to £3,900 a year.

The council is also highlighting that support is still available through its Helping Hand service for people who may not qualify for pension credit but who are still struggling financially. The team can offer emergency support, practical guidance or supply contact details for other organisations that provide food support or specialist advice.

Buckinghamshire Council Leader Martin Tett said:

“With the government's decision to withdraw winter fuel payments from all except those in receipt of pension credit or other means tested benefits, the council estimates 93% of all Buckinghamshire pensioners could lose this allowance, which is so vital to many of our older households.

“A significant concern is that a number of eligible pensioners are not currently claiming pension credit, so will miss out on a winter fuel payment when they are eligible and in genuine need. Please do check if you or someone you know is eligible – it is critical that those eligible for these payments receive them.

“And if you or your loved ones aren't eligible for pension credit, remember you can contact our Helping Hand team to discuss other potential support.”
