A letter from our Team Rector

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. John 1:14

I had just cycled about 30 miles the previous day. It was a relief to step from the tropical heat into the air conditioned lobby of a hotel that I had just found in Kanyakumari at the very southern tip of India. This was not a time and place that I expected to see anyone decorating a Christmas Tree, but this is what the hotel staff were doing as I was checking in.

In October I had set off on a long journey that had begun in Jordan, taken me through remote parts of Eastern Turkey and finally through the states of Kerala and Tamil Nadu in southern India. Christmas was the last thing on my mind but it dawned on me that it was now the last day of November and Advent was about start.

On Christmas Day we read the inspired words from John's gospel about the mystery at the heart of the Christian message. The 'Word became flesh and dwelt among us'. If you read the whole chapter you get a fuller sense of the whole mystery. Through the birth of Jesus, God the creator of the world entered into and lived in His created universe. The Greek world translated as 'lived' is eskenosen which has the sense of camping in a tent. In the Old Testament the very early semi-nomadic Israelites worshiped God in a tent. Jesus is presented in the gospels as camping in the world. God is travelling alongside humanity.

In October last year I had just set off on a big journey. In the Diocese of Birmingham, to which I previously belonged before arriving here, vicars are offered the opportunity to take a three month sabbatical after completing seven years of service, so I decided to take a journey following the legend of an ancient disciple of Jesus who is also featured in John's gospel. That disciple was St Thomas, sometimes known as 'Doubting Thomas' who is celebrated in India as having brought the good news of Jesus to that sub-continent.

As I'm a keen cyclist I decided to do journey with a bicycle. I didn't cycle all the way but I did cover over a thousand miles through different terrain. Travelling solo, I stayed at monasteries and with ancient Christian communities along the way. What really struck me was the breath of cultures that have been impacted by the message of Word of God who is Jesus.

Epiphany is the season immediately after Christmas when we remember other significant journeys such as the wise men coming from the East ,and the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt. During Epiphany on 17th January at 7pm at Soulbury Village Hall I would like to present a film to the community my journey into the East. This film is suitable for everyone, whether or not you have a faith. I have showed it to my cycle club back in Solihull as well as to my local mosque there. You are all invited and it would be great to meet you if you can make it.



Soulbury Millennium Green - November Report

November's meeting of the SMG committee was mostly dominated by feedback from our recent Fireworks display. Whilst the event was largely considered very successful, we did receive some complaints which are covered in the Fireworks De-brief.

Finance: With further positive inflowing proceeds from the recent Fireworks Display event our finances remain in a robust position. Whilst we still await invoices for printing banners & mobile toilet hire, we are able to estimate the event will realise a profit similar to last year's figure of £2385. It was reported that our current account balance was £15,078.84 with £49.01 still remaining Petty Cash. The Bucks lottery yielded £8.00 for November. A list of spare parts & service costs for our Cadet Ride-On Mower has been supplied to Richard to assist when advertising it for sale disposal.

Firework De-Brief: The attendance figures were lower this year at 427, largely resulting to last year's same day Stewkley display being cancelled, providing an extra fillip. We subcontracted out the bar facility for an agreed site rental charge to the Boot Inn and benefitted by their professional expertise in providing this service facility. The Inflatable Pub & table benches provided by them was very well received by all and made a favourable impression. Well done the Boot, thanks to Russ, Jema and others for their hard work. Our local fairground were also present with a Mini wheel ride and candy floss booth supporting the event. The fireworks procured were louder than we were led to believe and some complaints were received from parents with very young children and an adjoining landowner complaining about the excessive amount of rocket sticks he was having to clear up from his livestock field. Another person was critical about the timetable, even though we advertised that gates wouldn't be open until 6:00 pm with bonfire lighting at 6:45 pm which is the time needed to safely process entrants through the gate. Otherwise, all other comments received were very appreciative and we were largely thanked for putting on a good show. Thanks to all the helpers, volunteers and SMG committee for making this a successful event.



Press Release from Buckinghamshire Council

Council reminds garden waste subscribers of upcoming service suspension

Buckinghamshire Council is reminding subscribers to its garden waste service that collections will soon be suspended for a 6-week period. This is an annual suspension that comes in during the winter when garden waste is at a minimal.

The last possible collection date for garden waste is Friday 13 December (normal collection days apply) and collections will resume from week commencing Monday 27 January.

Thomas Broom, Buckinghamshire Council's Cabinet Member for Climate Change and Environment, said:

"Even though the weather can still seem mild, the suspension dates are planned out well in advance to match the period when garden waste is typically at its lowest. During the suspension period, we train staff and redirect crews to allow for the increased amount of general waste and recycling over the Christmas holidays.

"Residents who need to dispose of garden waste during the suspension period can still do so at any of our 10 Household Recycling Centres free of charge. All sites are open 9am to 4pm."

To find out which days your local Household Recycling Centre is open and further details of what can and cannot be taken to a centre, visit: www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/waste-and-recycling

Thomas added: "Garden waste collected from homes across Buckinghamshire or taken to Household Recycling Centres is processed locally into high-quality compost. Residents can buy Community Compost at all of our Household Recycling Centres. All the proceeds from the sales of the Community Compost are set aside for good causes with an annual funding award expected in April 2025."
